The Organizations

Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc., founded on January 13, 1913, is a non-profit organization whose purpose is to provide assistance and support through established programs in local communities throughout the world. A sisterhood of more than 300,000 predominately Black college educated women, the Sorority currently has over 1,000 chapters located in the United States, England, Japan (Tokyo and Okinawa), Germany, the Virgin Islands, Bermuda, the Bahamas and the Republic of Korea.

The Sorority focuses on a five-point programmatic thrust:

- Educational Development
- > Economic Development
- > International Awareness and Involvement
- > Physical and Mental Health
- Political Awareness and Involvement

Glen Ellyn Area Alumnae Chapter was chartered in January 1977 by 24 visionary women and now currently has over 250 members. The chapter serves the Western Suburbs of Chicago including towns in Cook, DuPage, Kane, Kendall, Will and DeKalb Counties via numerous annual programs, projects, scholarships and initiatives.

During the early years some of GEAAC's public service projects included: food baskets for families in need at Thanksgiving and Christmas, weekly story hour at Loyola Children's Hospital, serving and assisting in shelters, Toy Disco, assistance at the Baptist Nursing Home, book drives, compiling and submitting lists of African-American books to public schools, and contributions to the DuPage County NAACP. The first major fundraiser was Miss Jabberwock (1979), in the form of a talent competition. Since then the need for service, leadership and empowerment has grown. Programs, outreach, and community partnerships have been expanded to help meet the needs of the community.

Minerva Educational Foundation, Inc. (MEF) was established in 1996 as a nonprofit tax exempt 501(c)(3) corporation that is organized to receive, invest and distribute funds for charitable, religious, educational and scientific purposes. The Foundation supports educational programs for young people and; conducts seminars and educational programs that provide for cultural, social and educational enrichment, particularly in the African American Community. MEF establishes partnerships with community organizations within the Western Suburban area of Chicago to facilitate new funding opportunities and serves as a resource and a conduit to support youth and families through educational development, counseling and referrals. The foundation relies on a web of support that includes individuals, families, professionals and volunteers, which provides strength and direction for positive community growth.

Our Story

The Glen Ellyn Area Alumnae Chapter of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. was chartered on January 23, 1977 and currently has over 250 members. Over the past 39 years since being chartered, GEAAC has provided hundreds of scholarships to high school seniors entering college, mentored students through its youth programs, and provided programs and services that enhance civic engagement and social welfare. GEAAC is known for its award winning programs and outstanding service and commitment to its community.

Each year GEAAC partners with local community organizations, local businesses and schools to bring awareness and solutions to the different issues that plague the community. GEAAC (www.dstglenellyn.org) is charged with empowering the local community and implementing programs aligned with the Sorority's Five Point Programmatic Thrust by offering resources to help promote economic responsibility, educational access, health and well-being, social action and international awareness.

- •Economic Development: Addresses the need for sustained and targeted actions that promote the standard of living and economic health of African American and historically marginalized communities through a myriad of initiatives designed to develop an understanding of all aspects of the financial system, including budgeting, home ownership, personal wealth management, entrepreneurship, and the steps to financial freedom.
- •Educational Development: Provides mentoring, educational activities and service learning opportunities for "at risk" young women and men through the following National Signature programs: The Dr. Betty Shabazz Delta Academy (girls ages 11 to 14); the Dr. Jeanne R. Noble Delta GEMS (Growing and Empowering Myself Successfully) Institute (girls ages 14-18); and EMBODI Empowering Males to Build Opportunities for Developing Independence (boys ages 11 to 18).
- •International Awareness and Involvement: Implements projects that provide opportunities for GEAAC members and the community to broaden their knowledge and understanding of other nations, increase their interest in international affairs, and enhance and sustain global visibility and impact of the Sorority's seven ongoing international projects.
- •Physical and Mental Health: Seeks to encourage behavioral lifestyle changes for the physical, mental and spiritual well-being of African American families, and address the challenges associated with achieving personal health success.
- Political Awareness and Involvement: Increase community's knowledge of current local, state and national issues; serve as informed and effective citizens, advocates and voters, and influence the enactment of legislation that impacts the African American community.

Our Success & Our Service

Over the years, GEAAC has received numerous regional and national awards for its outstanding community service and programs. GEAAC has been awarded chapter of the year, received awards for outstanding programs and initiatives and has been publically recognized by external organizations. Each year, GEAAC builds upon its success and reaches further into the community.

The chapter has been awarded several grants to help fund its programs, and has been given the opportunity to pilot signature programs within its serviced community.

Community Impact:

Between 2010 and 2016 GEAAC awarded \$147,031 in college scholarships to highly qualified students. GEAAC sponsored members of Delta GEMS to attend the 3-day Presidential Academy during the 49th (2010) and 50th (2013) National Conventions of DST. Provided life changing dialogue, resources and workshops to over 100 boys who attended the 2016 EMBODI Conference. More than 50 students were registered to vote in 2015 & 2016. Empowered over 200 girls during the 2015 Just Us Girls Conference through female responsive programs and activities. Mentored more than 100 students throughout 2016. Each year, GEAAC focuses on empowering, educating and inspiring youth and adults.
