














All that I know about the US Navy, I know from my grandfather. We used to play this game when I was young - we called it "myth or legend". He would ask me myth or legend, and upon my choosing, he would tell me a story. One of his favorite topics, and mine, was that of his father, whom I called Grampy Gramps Davis. I only got to meet my great grandfather a few times before he died, and I was too young to remember most of them. Yet in my head he was a strong, funny, resilient man, a picture painted by my beloved grandpa, who looked up to him dearly. When I answered "legend" to my grandpa's inquisition, he would always begin his stories about his father with the facts. He would speak of the incomprehensible size of the ship. He would spin a story of how there was a captain, highly respected and beloved by a large crew. My grandpa would talk about how despite the size of the ship, the quarters were small and all the accommodations tight. I would be entranced by this tale about valiant men fighting for what they valued. Of all the stories I was told, there were three that were my favorite. Once my grandpa told me of Japanese Bombers spotting the ship. He would talk about how they swooped down, right before the Battle of the Coral Sea. The men were frightened and yet one of their own, Butch O'Hare, shot down most of the bombers, and saved them all, a hero. He was honored, and the Chicago airport was named after him. I was in awe of the respect and friendship among the men. Another one of my favorites was when the order to abandon ship was given. My great grandfather jumped with one of his friends, and they survived two hours alone in the sea before being rescued. And my absolute favorite story, that of which I would make my grandpa repeat over and over, was that of the ice cream. The ship had been hit, and was exploding. One of the men went below deck and brought up ice cream, claiming that, "It's all going to go to waste anyway". I know that my great grandfather loved ice cream, and that he ate it among his friends as the ship exploded. I know that my great grandfather was beloved by many, and that he lives on in my grandpa, and hopefully with me as well. I hope to make my family proud when I attend Colorado State University as part of the honors program. I am pursuing a degree in Neuroscience, with which I hope to become a neurosurgeon in the future. I cannot afford my undergraduate education and that of medical school, so every bit of money helps, but I hope that my experience in volunteering clubs, medical internships, and as an athlete, will make it worth it.




