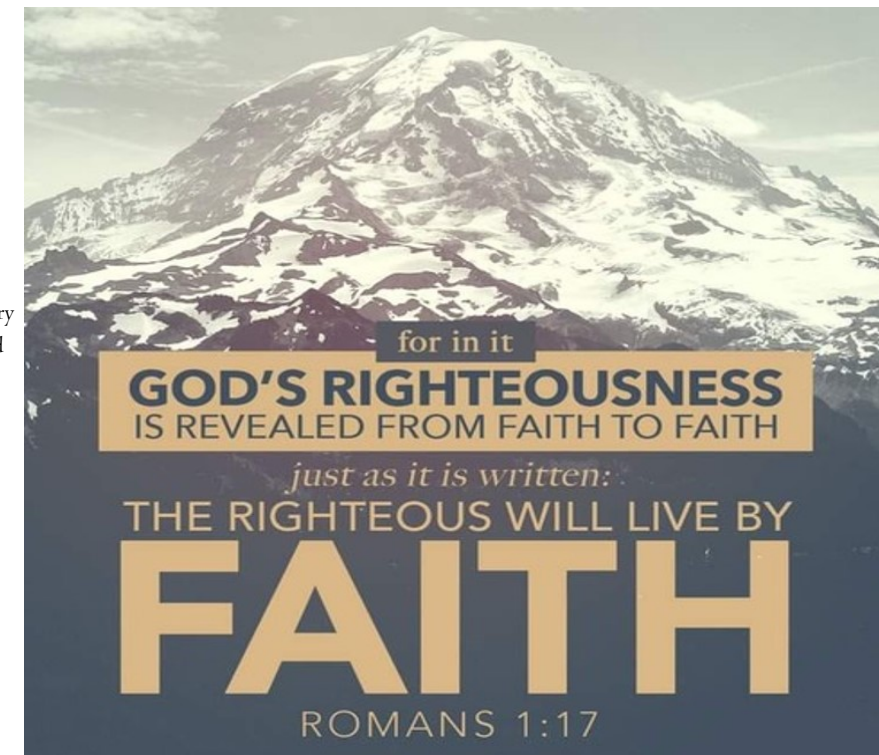

One of the most important questions in life is that of the existence of God. Depending on how you fall philosophically or religiously, the answer carries dire consequences.

It was Thomas B. 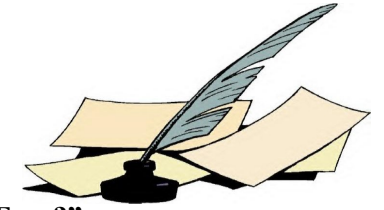

“Will You be an Ezra?”

There is a wonderful three-point sermon found in Ezra 7:10. The verse says, “For Ezra had prepared his heart to seek the Law of the Lord, and to do it, and to teach statutes and ordinances in Israel.”

Ezra determined to seek the Law of the Lord.

The text actually says that he had prepared his heart to do this.

How might one prepare their mind, their spiritual heart, to seek the laws of God in today's world? Unlike Ezra, we are fortunate enough to have the complete, perfect law of liberty the Bible, to guide us. We can pick up this gold mine of spiritual information almost any time, delve into its precepts, and learn how to be better in every aspect of life.

Ezra Determined to do God's Laws.

He was going to put them into practice in his life. Sometimes people wonder why their lives are so full of turmoil and discontent. Often this is because they have forgotten God's laws and gone back into a sinful lifestyle.

Mankind always needs to remember that God's laws are for his well-being.

Ezra Determined to Teach God's Ordinances.

Is this not what we all are to be about as children of God? Did not our Savior say in His last earthly instructions that we are to make disciples? This involves teaching the plan of salvation. Did Jesus not also say that we are to teach these disciples to observe all things He has commanded (Mt. 28:19-20)? This also involves teaching. If one is to “observe” something, they must know what to observe and how to observe.

Ezra certainly knew the key to gaining heaven. Will you be an “Ezra” and be able to “unlock the door of your eternal home?”

I asked, “Why doesn't somebody do something?”

Then I realized I was somebody.
