**Gracie Stienike** 


Gracie will be attending the University of Nebraska at Kearney. She will be majoring in Elementary Education and will be a member of the Loper Volleyball Team.

The Beat
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A number of years ago, the United Methodist Church refocused on our purpose as Christians in this faith tradition. After much conversation around the world and careful word-smithing (editing), we came up with the phrase that our purpose as Christians is: "To make disciples, who make disciples, for the transformation of the world." We have lived with that phrase for much of the time that I have been serving local congregations, and we still seem to struggle a bit with just exactly what that means—in the local church and in the larger connectional church as well.

For the last two years my continuing education has been through The Academy for Spiritual Formation. This Academy is operated through the Upper Room of the United Methodist Church and consists of eight 5-day retreats over a two year period. In the first year, these quarterly retreats follow a curriculum (both reading and presentation) that invites us to do the interior work of growing in our love of God; the second year focuses on how we live this out in the world, touching the lives of others. In other words: we are being made disciples, who make disciples, for the transformation of the world. In April I completed this program and was commissioned into the Academy Forum. Thank you for your help in that process!

This is a very methodical approach to the work before us. And that is very fitting, as our name "Methodist" grew out of the teasing John Wesley received concerning his methodical approach to everything. Our local churches also need to grow and develop methodical approaches to disciple-making. In my experience, these have not been as organized as one might expect, and often reflect one of the places where we need to do some of our work. If you listen carefully to the conversation around leadership groups here in Gothenburg you might hear this in the conversations about worship services—how many and when?; Sunday School for all ages—even in the summer?; small groups like Coffee and Conversation, Bible studies, Youth Group, etc.?; confirmation—what age and how long? Even our Endowment Committee looks at this in its decision-making around which youth will receive a scholarship from the congregation.

One of my colleagues from the Academy shared the story that one of the very faithful men in his Men's Group asked him: "Am I a disciple of Jesus? What does it mean to be a disciple?" Such a comment from someone who is regularly in church reminds me that our language often gets in the way of the work that we are trying to do, and if one person asked this, how about all of those who are too afraid to ask? It also reminded me that this work needs to be intentional and methodical to every generation, because we lose the words and concepts as we go along. We also need to be constantly deepening our own relationships with God and one another as we grow in following the teachings of Jesus.

Because, of course, that is what it means to be a disciple of Jesus. We are called to live out of, and into the teachings of Jesus. It isn't just about saying the right thing, it is about living in the way that Jesus taught. And our disciple-making plan of helping people to learn what Jesus taught and encouraging people to live it? We are very much in the middle of that conversation! Come and be a part of it—at worship, in small groups, committees, teaching and learning! Blessings, Pastor Jamie




