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RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

TOWN OF KREMMLING  
REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING  
May 16, 2018

The Board of Trustees, for the Town of Kremmling, met in the boardroom located at 200 Eagle Avenue. Mayor Grover Pryor called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Trustees present: Holly Martinson, Gina Schroeder, Jason Wikberg, Leo Pesch, Dave Sammons and Erik Woog. Staff present: Public Works Director Jason Bock and Police Chief Scott Spade.

Trustee Martinson wanted to clarify in the board meeting minutes from May 2 that she wasn't supposed to only be a backup liaison for Dave Sammons, that she would step in anywhere she needed to. Trustee Sammons also noted that Trustee Schroeder should be listed as liaison for office personnel.

WOOG MOVED TO APPROVE THE REGULAR TOWN BOARD MEETING MINUTES FOR THE MAY 2, 2018 MEETING AS AMENDED PER THIS DOCUMENT AS DISCUSSED. SAMMONS SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

SAMMONS MOVED TO ACCEPT THE PAID AND UNPAID BALANCES FROM MAY 3, 2018 THROUGH MAY 16, 2018, THIS IS THE REVISED COPY WHICH INCLUDES SHELTON ASSOCIATES FOR THE SMITH APPRAISAL SECOND HALF IN THE TOTAL OF \$74,087.61. WOOG SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

Trustee Woog would like to add a discussion item to the agenda, to update the board on his conversation with Colorado Mosquito Control.

WOOG MOVED TO APPROVE THE AGENDA AS PRESENTED, WITH A DISCUSSION ITEM FOR AN UPDATE. PESCH SECONDED. ALL "AYE" VOTES.

There were no citizen comments.

Mayor Pryor swore in new police officer Michael Minhas.

The Mayor had no report.

The Police Chief reported:

- The body cams he had ordered have arrived. He purchased 6 so that they have spares. They will not be used until they have a policy in place and everyone has been trained on their use.
- The new police vehicle has been ordered, along with the electronics board. He went with the Interceptor, which was the SUV, without the ecoboost option.
- They have been starting with their junk ordinance notifications.

The Public Works Director reported:

- They have all the town sprinkler systems up and running. It took them a little while to repair any damage that was done over the winter.
- He purchased a new lawnmower since the last meeting when it was discussed. It has been delivered and is in use already. The old mower is in Minnesota on consignment.
- He did some research about moving the entranceway sign on Highway 9, and the project isn't something his crew can handle. The base pieces will have to be re-poured and the decorative rock will be hard to move. He felt that the sign makers would be best to do the work. Trustee Sammons asked that we contact the sign company and get a bid to move the sign.
- The town reservoir did fill, to within about 6 inches of spilling. He feels the town is in good shape for water for the summer.

Jon Stavney from the Northwest Colorado Council of Governments was next on the agenda, but since he was planning on staying for the entirety of the meeting, asked that the county give their presentation on the building code update next.

Lee Staab, Grand County Manager, spoke to the board regarding the 2015 building code updates. Diann Butler, who works in the economic development department for the county, Robert Davis, the new community development director, and Larry Banman, who is a building inspector, were all present at the meeting. Larry went over the major changes in the new building code updates, which include

some building sprinkler requirements, some increased insulation requirements, and solid fuel burning devices.

The board discussed replacing the backs of the town's entranceway signs, that originally were all supposed to say happy trails, but were changed to other sayings. Public Works Director Bock had stated previously in the meeting that he felt we needed to get a bid from Lunsford Signs to know what the cost would be to move the existing sign on Highway 9. The board all agreed to table all discussion regarding the moving of the sign and the replacement of the backs of the signs, until bids were received for the projects.

Trustee Woog had spoken with Colorado Mosquito Control about the potential of forming a mosquito taxing district, or even a volunteer organization. The board was still interested in discussing other mitigation options, so the item will be added as a future agenda item.

John Stavney from NWCCOG introduced himself to the board. He talked about some of the programs that NWCCOG offers. He offered to help with the facilitation of hiring a new manager even if to just polish up the help wanted post.
