Dear Friends in Christ at St. Paul's,

A long standing preaching commitment keeps me from being present with you on July 12, but my thoughts go back over 50 years to the days when I would drive my '64 Mustang up that tree-lined drive to the little white church on the hill. There was no indoor plumbing, just a double-hole outhouse in the parking lot. An annual swarming of termites could be expected from the stumps of trees under the church, and there were two entirely separate rooms until Bobby Moeller knocked out a wall to provide for expanded seating. Heat came from a temperamental in-floor stove. Air conditioning came from open windows. But it was God's House and beautiful to us.

More important than the building, however, are the memories of the hundreds of people who over the years were baptized, confirmed, married, or buried from that church. Many of them were important figures in your lives.

But the people of St. Paul's have always seen the mission of serving Christ and His people as more important than the preservation of facilities. Maybe it started by Bobby Moeller knocking down that wall his relatives had helped to build. Later the old parsonage was turned into an educational building (with indoor plumbing), then by the construction of a new worship and fellowship area, now with additional expansion that means the little white church will give up its place to new facilities as able to serve the current and future generations as it did the generations of the past.

And so on this day I remember the past, but more importantly, I rejoice that you are still lively enough to look to the future and to value an expansion of ministry over a decaying monument to what used to be. God bless your ministry!

Dear Saints of St. Paul's,

Almost 41 years ago to the date I was Ordained and Installed as St. Paul's first full time pastor (July 7, 1974). St. Paul was my first call and really my first love. I was so excited. Fourteen subdivisions and the possibility of growing a church was a reality. We invited Richard Hintz from the Southeastern District to help us develop a Master Plan for us. First a multipurpose building. Then an education wing and finally tear down the parish house and build a sanctuary.

The little white church surrounded by tobacco fields on three sides. Our archetict, John Corkill said that we should ask Willie Moeller to give the church the land down below or one day there would be a "big box store" would move in and no one would be able to see the church any more. (Was he a prophet?)

I remember arriving in the Southern heat of the Summer. No thought was given to a church office. I brought a typewriter, but we did not have any equipment to print bulletins with. Pastor Eric Peterson, the last of the duo-parish pastors, convinced Grace to buy new equipment and give us their old machinery.

As that first Winter arrived I learned about the "hell hole" in the church. An oil fired furnace with a large grate in the floor known as the "hell hole." For about 2 pews near the "hell hole" one would sweat. Two pews back from there the temp. was just right. Beyond that people would be freezing! Then with the help of Freddie Benton we installed electric heater which kept everyone from freezing.

The church would hold about 50 and the "wing" about 40. When the church would sing a hymn it would always sound like an echo, with the wing always a little behind the church. There would be Dorthea playing the organ between the two groups. Then we had the "black" era, when after painting the church we found out that all the paint we used had been stolen from Andrews Airforce Base and the newly installed cross had been cut from a piece of steel stolen from the Walter Reed Army Hospital. We had to ask the question, "Will God bless a HOT church?"

And who of us "geezers" can forget how the church was broken into, and poker was played inside with money that had been in the slot machines which were broken open on the tomb stones in our cemetery. How someone was walking around with lite candles and started our old paraments on fire -- with the insurance money buying new parament for the new church.

The old church holds many wonderful memories for me and my family. Two of our three children were baptized there, one during a Christmas Eve Service. The weddings, and funerals for the faithful member who worked so hard serving their Lord and Savior in Southern Maryland.
