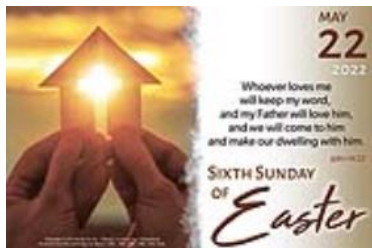


MAY 21 & 22, 2022 SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER



RETURNING TO ORDINARY LIFE

Six weeks into our Easter rejoicing, the Church gives us Readings today that start preparing us for a return to ordinary life. The Acts of the Apostles and the Gospel both dwell on proper daily behavior for followers of Jesus, while the Reading from Revelation reminds us why we bother with laws at all. In Acts, leaders of the church meet to discuss which essential elements of the Mosaic Law converts must obey, if they wish to be disciples of Jesus Christ. John's Gospel reflects back to the Last Supper discourse, when Jesus himself emphasizes the importance of obeying God's Commandments. Observing God's law, says Jesus, shows a desire to be intimate with the Lord. We follow rules not for their own sake, but to love God and neighbor better. This more excellent love brings us closer to Revelation's vision of paradise, gleaming with *"the splendor of God."*

FAITH-FILLED YOUNG PEOPLE

Speaking about the family, I would like to begin by addressing the young people first.

When I think of a model with whom young people can identify with, our Mother, Mary, always comes to mind: her courage, the way she knew how to listen, and her dedication to service.

She was courageous and determined to say "yes" to the Lord.

You young people, who want to build something new, a better world, follow her example, take risks!

Don't forget that in order to follow Mary you need to discern and discover what Jesus wants from you, not what you might think you can do.

And in this discernment, it's a great help to listen to the words of grandparents.

In those words of grandparents, you will find a wisdom that will take you beyond the issues of the moment.

They will provide an overview of your concerns.

Let us pray, brothers and sisters, so that all young people, called to live life to the fullest, may discover in Mary's life the way to listen, the depth of discernment, the courage of faith, and dedication to service. Pope Francis
