As illustrated below, the new monument will be made of brick with an arched top and will be a bit taller than the old monument. It will have a dark granite background sandblasted with gold metallic letters. The distinctive styling of the “A” in Andover will be preserved. The monument should be much easier to read from Parker Road and should really add some beauty to our entryway. The winning contractor is Bighorn Signs of Wheatridge. They have extensive experience in entryway monuments and have done several in our area. Look for construction to begin soon.
