#### PAGE 2 A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ROBERT.....

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

During this time of year, according to our liturgical calendar, we are moving through the season of Epiphany which is meant to be a time in our church year where we contemplate what God is calling us to do. Each one of the Sunday morning texts that we look at during this season focus on this idea of calling. Thus it is my hope that as each of us huddles away from the cold during this strange winter we have been given, we are looking at where we are, and if this is the place God has called us to be. This doesn't necessarily mean that we are comfortable, because often God calls us into uncomfortable situations- remember the story of Jonah and how he rejected God's call because it made him uncomfortable. It is important to note that while the disciples left everything behind to follow Christ, calling does not always mean that we need to do the same. It could be that God is calling us to alter just one small aspect of our life, or it could be that we are right where God has called us to be and nothing needs to change at this time.

Hopefully by the 14th of this month you will have answered this question because while some might be giving cards, and little boxes of chocolates to their loved ones on this day the rest of us will be smearing black ash across their foreheads as we commit ourselves to the season of Lent. As I stated before, during Epiphany we are asked to discern what we are being called to do. Once we reach Lent that focus changes and now we are being asked to contemplate how we are going to live out that calling, and/or how are we currently living out that calling. Lent is a time for inner examination. To help us along in this "soul searching" we are called to enter into a Lenten discipline where we give something up and/or perform some task/activity that challenges us and reminds us that this is meant to be a time of self-reflection. My daughter's declaration that she would give up all vegetables one Lent, would be considered one of those things that probably won't work since we have to force her to eat vegetables anyway. In her case giving up candy or Culver's for Lent would have been far more appropriate. However you choose to honor the season of Lent, my only hope is that it brings you closer to God.

Each season of the church year has a specific purpose related to how we live out our faith. As the seasons change we are asked to focus on different things; Advent - Preparation, Christmas - celebration of new life, Epiphany – Calling, Lent – faith life, Easter – celebration of Christ's gift of forgiveness and life, Season after Pentecost – Jesus and the Bible's many teachings for our lives. Each of these seasons and the many celebration days within each are important and help us focus on the different aspects of our Christian faith and our lives. It reminds us that Christianity is not just about one thing, just as we are not just about one thing. While there are simple messages at the heart of our faith, living out those simple messages, such as "love the Lord with all your heart, mind and soul and love your neighbor as yourself" is far more complex. Our liturgical calendar not only helps us live out that faith, but it also helps us focus on the different aspects of our faith that may be neglected at times.
