Supplies Needed For VBS

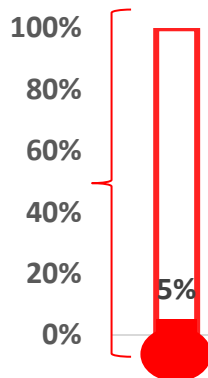

Interested in helping to keep the church and parsonage lawn looking nice to visitors and passerby's? Please see Kim Peters and let her know you'd be interested in helping out.



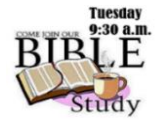
Hymn Sing!

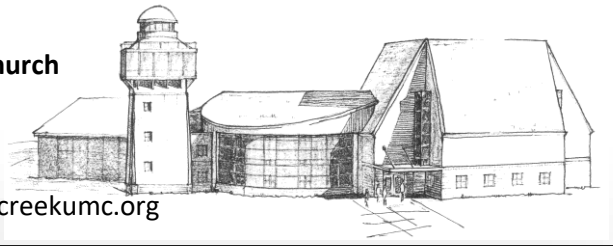
The Refuge Golf Tournament
