Corporate Greed and Political Cronyism

The EpiPen, a lifesaving allergy treatment, was sold in packages of three in 2001 for \$75.80. Purchased by Mylan Pharmaceuticals in 2007, the cost rose to \$124.00. Today the price for two pens is \$609. Mylan has raised the price 15 times, up 400% from 2009. CEO of Mylan, Heather Bresch, earned nearly \$19 million in total compensation last year.

And over the past three years, she made \$54 million. Now here is the kicker, Bresch's mother, Gayle Manchin, head of the National Association of State Boards of Education, pushed for Mylan's EpiPens to be bought by schools. Her father is Democratic Sen. Joe Manchin, a member of the Senate Commerce committee.



Trump and Clinton debated each other for the first time last night.

Clinton won on points. She had more command of the details and the cleaner answers. Trump did a lot of interrupting and he was defensive. If this were a college debate competition, Clinton would be declared the winner. I call that victory on the 2D chess board. **But voters don't care about facts and debating style. They care about how they feel.**

Trump and Clinton both seemed "presidential" enough. That mattered more for Trump. We haven't seen him off the teleprompter lately. So Trump passed that test by being sufficiently serious.

Clinton looked as if she was drugged, tired, sick, or generally unhealthy, even though she was mentally alert and spoke well. But her eyes were telling a different story. She had the look of someone whose doctors had engineered 90 minutes of alertness for her just for the event.

Some will say Clinton outperformed expectations because she didn't cough, collapse, or die right on stage. That would be true if she also looked healthy in general, and her campaign schedule from here on out is full.

Clinton's smile seemed forced, artificial, and frankly creepy. My neighbor Kristina hypothesized that Botox was making her smile look unnatural. Science tells us that when a person's mouth smiles, but their eyes don't match the smile, they look disingenuous if not creepy. But whatever the reason, something looked off to me.

To be fair, Trump's physical appearance won't win him any votes either. But his makeup looked better than I have seen it and his haircut was as good as it gets for him, and he was otherwise his normal self that some voters hate and some like.

But the most interesting question has to do with what problem both of them were trying to solve with the debate. Clinton tried to look healthy and I don't think she completely succeeded. But **Trump needed to solve exactly one problem: Look less scary.** Trump needed to counter Clinton's successful branding of him as having a bad temperament to the point of being dangerous to the country. Trump accomplished exactly that...by...losing the debate.

Trump was defensive, and debated poorly at points, but he did not look crazy. And pundits noticed that he intentionally avoided using his strongest attacks regarding Bill Clinton's scandals. He showed control. **He stayed in the presidential zone under pressure.** And in so doing, he solved for his only remaining problem. He looked safer.

By tomorrow, no one will remember what either of them said during the debate. But we will remember how they made us feel.

Clinton won the debate last night. And while she was doing it, Trump won the election. He had one thing to accomplish – being less scary – and he did it.

October 11: Assemblyman Brian W. Jones has served in the California State Assembly since 2010. He represents the 71st Assembly District, which encompasses Southern Riverside and Eastern San Diego Counties. With his term coming to an end, we are fortunate to have the Assemblyman join us as we are only one month away from the general election. With all of the hype, debates, and planning devoted to a contentious Presidential race, we don't want the importance of what is happening in Sacramento to get lost in the shuffle.

Assemblyman Jones has earned a reputation as a strong fiscal conservative and a vocal advocate for a smaller, more responsible government. His deep convictions in free market principles, the need for government reform and tax relief comes from his service in both the public and private sector. His background as a businessman and his service as Councilmember and Vice Mayor of Santee strengthened his resolve to restore decision making to the local level and to ensure that tax monies meet community needs.

He initially ran for Assembly in 2009 because of his frustration over what was taking place in Sacramento. Active in his service to the state, Assemblyman Jones currently serves as the Vice-Chair of the Business, Professions and Consumer Protection Committee and is a member of the Appropriations, Budget Subcommittee 1: Health and Human Services, Budget, Joint Legislative Ethics, and the Joint Legislative Audit Committees.

The Assemblyman is a strong believer in the Second Amendment, is opposed to illegal immigration, and works towards reforms aimed at curtailing the political influence of public-sector labor unions. He has been a supporter of the Stop Special Interest Money initiative and was involved in an effort to repeal the California DREAM Act.

A Santee resident since 1978, Assemblyman Jones is on the Board of Directors of the East County Boys and Girls Club, a member of the Lemon Grove Rod and Gun Club, and a lifetime member of the California Rifle and Pistol Association.

November 15: The second Tuesday of the month is election day, so in November our meeting will be the third Tuesday and final program of 2016. Our speaker, Jason Roe, has been deeply involved in conservative leadership for decades, from Executive Director, Republican Party of San Diego County, to National Media Spokesperson for Marco Rubio during his presidential campaign. Jason will review the election results, and look to the future of the Republican Party. What a great way to finish the year!


