The phone rings...."Good Morning, Touchet Schools, this is Darla."

And so begins another day at the Touchet Schools. **Darla Nolan '75**, is the executive secretary of the Touchet Schools, but she describes her job as customer service. And the customers are whoever needs most anything at the school. If you call, or walk into the school, if you want to talk to a teacher or administrator, get a message to your child, put a notice in the "Boxholder", find out what time the bus leaves for the game in Pomeroy or what time the game starts, you will probably talk to Darla. She is the one who calls home if a student doesn't come to school, and arranges for a substitute teacher when one is needed. Her phone rings on the average of 40 times a day from someone outside the school who needs information or to leave a message. And her phone rings on the average of 25 times

a day from someone inside the school who needs her attention and expertise. Many inquiries start with "where is....", and amazingly she usually knows where most people and items are. And then there are the walk ups, those who come to the office in person. Often it is a student needing to use the phone or get a band aid, pick up something a parent dropped off or check out to go to an outside appointment. Darla also works with teachers coordinating purchasing of supplies, and inputting grades, and many other levels of student involvement. In her job description, it says "must meet multiple demands and deadlines in a pressure situation and maintain high levels of quality work." That describes Darla. Everybody is a customer, and all are greeted with a smile.

Darla Nolan is one of 16 classified staff who work at the Touchet schools. They are the secretaries, the bus drivers and cooks, the librarian and nurse, the paraprofessionals who work directly with students, and the custodians who maintain a clean and safe environment. They are described as the "pulse of the school." They are a dedicated group of individuals, with employment at the school ranging from 5 to 34 years.

Alaine Turner is currently the business manager, and has worked in various jobs in the 34 years she has worked at the school. Her job involves finances and human resources. She pays the bills and does the payroll.



Laurie Durfee is the school nurse and the elementary building secretary.

She keeps track of everybody in and out of the elementary building, and provides much of the same customer service to elementary staff and students as Darla. In her job as nurse, she dispenses all medications prescribed for students while at school. She is responsible for the health and safety of students and for maintaining all health records.

Debby Short is currently the librarian.

Laurie and Debbie have worked at the school 20 and 26 years respectively.

Mike Mayberry has been the Transportation and Maintenance Supervisor for the last ten years. The operation of the physical building, the heating and air conditioning systems, the custodians and their responsibilities, the irrigation system and grounds, the buses, and their routes and drivers, are all under his watch. He makes the recommendation to the superintendent of a “go no-go” for the buses when the roads may be unsafe due to weather conditions for both transport to and from school and extracurricular activities. **Jose Martinez** is the Assistant for Maintenance and has been working closely with Mr. Mayberry for 9 years.



Custodians are **DeeVee Garcia '76**, with 15 years on the job, and **Carmen Martinez**, with 9 years. They do the daily cleaning and maintenance, and major cleaning during Christmas break and during the summer. Every carpeted floor is vacuumed every day, and vinyl floors are hand mopped 3 days a week and cleaned with a machine 2 days a week. And, of course, the bathrooms are cleaned daily, every garbage can emptied, windows and mirrors shined, and furniture dusted.



If you or your children have ridden a Touchet School bus in the last 22 years, then you have ridden with the slate of current Bus Drivers. **Dick Hanson '53**, is the newest with 22 years experience, **Traci Weber '84**, has been driving for 27 years, and **Darrell Loney '64**, has been working at the school and driving bus for 34 years. All three graduated from Touchet. Bus drivers must have a Commercial Drivers License (CDL) with a special endorsement for school bus drivers, a current first aid card, three hours of additional training per year, and a physical every other year. Our school buses traveled 51,714 miles last year, including transport to and from school, field trips, and sporting events. Weather, distance, and darkness can complicate driving. It can become easy to take safe bus trips for granted and we can thank our experienced and dedicated drivers for making sure students arrive safely at their destination.

Kirsten Royce, the Head Cook, is usually the first one to arrive at school each morning. She walks in the back door of the kitchen at 6:30 am and begins preparations for the breakfast she will begin serving at 7:30. There are usually around 65 students who show up for breakfast, and breakfast is free for all those on free or reduced lunch. Soon after breakfast clean up, preparations start for lunch. Lunches require a minimum of 2 oz protein, 1 ½ cups of vegetables for the high school, divided between red and green vegetables, fruit, and bread, pasta or rice. Mrs. Royce serves whole grain pasta, brown rice only, and 80% of the bread is whole grain. Milk is served at both breakfast and lunch. She is required to serve certain foods that most of the Touchet students are not fond of, no matter which way they are served. A couple of those are sweet potatoes and beans. (Legumes, not green beans, which the students like). According to the research, an unfamiliar food can be served 15 times before it becomes familiar and a person may start to like it. They are served in the hopes that students will someday broaden their food choices. Helping Mrs. Royce in the kitchen are **Margo Pack**, **Mina Dorman**, and **Sheri Reiswig**.



The Paraprofessionals work directly with students under the supervision of a teacher. They can give extra help with reading or math problems, make copies and correct papers and may travel from building to building to help in any classroom where they are needed. They also do all the recess duty, as well. The Parapros are **Lisa Richards**, **Barb Curfman**, and **Mina Dorman**.

The classified staff at the Touchet Schools are an essential part of the quality of the educational experience for our students.

TRACKING THE INDIANS



In high school, Todd's experiences were similar to many students who graduated from Touchet in the late 70's and early 80's. Growing up and living in Touchet provided him with many experiences unique to small towns and rural living. Strong connections to community, solid academic preparation, and numerous opportunities to work and develop skills that would help him prepare for adult life. Lettering in football, basketball and baseball, some of Todd's most memorable sports memories are grounded in his experiences helping lead Touchet to its first state championship as a running back and co-captain of the 1979 football team.

Life after graduation has also afforded Todd many unique opportunities and exposed him to many challenging and diverse life, work, and family experiences that have literally "taken him all over the globe." Presently living and working in Al Khobar, Saudi Arabia, Todd is employed as the General Manager of the GE Oil & Gas Pressure Control Division overseeing a state of the art manufacturing center that supplies wellhead and pressure control equipment to the Saudi Arabian market and beyond. In this position, Todd oversees a workforce of 60+ employees and helped GE realize in excess of \$100 million dollars in sales in 2012.

Prior to his advancement into managerial roles, Todd's resume included over 10 years experience providing technical service and support to energy industry companies. His duties encompassed development and testing of tools and equipment, job site supervision, training of technicians and specialized assignments in support of deep water drilling projects. In addition to assignments in the Middle East, Todd also has spent extensive time working in West Africa, the Gulf of Mexico and Alaska. A key primer for his early employment in the energy systems sector was attainment of deep-water diving certifications from the Commercial Diving Institute in Seattle, followed by a 6 year stint employed as a Commercial Diver. Todd's professional experiences involved all aspects of deep sea diving including underwater construction, welding and rigging.

Todd is also a U.S Navy veteran and served as the Gun Mount (Turret) Captain aboard the USS John Rodgers. Somewhere in his travels and adventures, Todd met and married his lovely wife Perla and the two of them now have a son, John Octavio Barclay Adams, who is presently 9 years old. Although Todd's commitments do not allow him to get back to the states and Touchet very often, he still considers this valley his home. 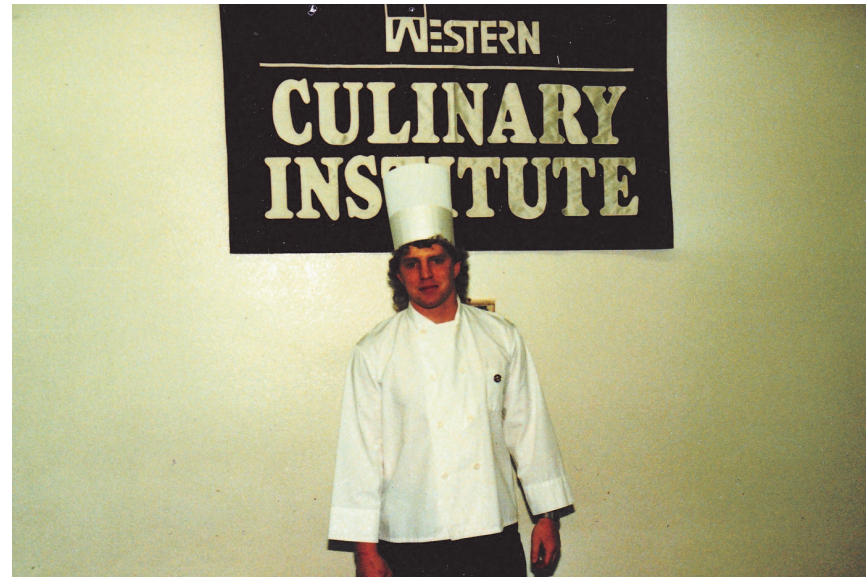

Robert Earl Schaeffer, 46, of Touchet passed away on Nov. 29, 2012. Robert was born on Oct. 17, 1966, in Walla Walla to Terry and Shirley Schaeffer. He grew up on the family farm in Touchet, enjoying his 4-H livestock and working on his red 1966 Ford Mustang. Robert was active in FFA and other school activities, playing football, basketball and baseball every year at Touchet High School and graduating in 1985. Robert attended Walla Walla Community College and graduated from the Western Culinary Institute in Portland in 1990. He married his wife, Sylvia (Ramirez), in 1993; and with their daughter Harlie (16), and son, Hayden (13), the family lived in Touchet on the farm where he was raised.

Robert was a fifth-generation wheat farmer alongside his dad, and they shared a deep love of working the land together. Robert served as chair of the Touchet School Board, president of the Touchet Booster Club, volunteered at the Walla Walla Fair and Pacific Little League, and especially loved being involved in his children's sports and school activities.
