We encourage scholars from all disciplines, including the Sciences, History, Literature, Economics, and Art, to submit proposals related to the conference's theme or any other aspect of the long eighteenth century in any geographical area.

Panel proposals (including fully-formed panels) are due by September 1, 2019. Individual paper proposals are due by October 15, 2019.
