- Honors courses are designed to develop increased skills in students' critical reading, writing, and thinking skills in order to prepare the student for university-level work.

GRADING POLICIES:

- As Honors course grades are given a GPA bonus on your students transcript, the expectations
 related to grading are higher. Students who may be accustomed to receiving very high grades in
 other classes may have to work harder to earn these grades in Honors courses.
