


SCIENCE	MUSIC		Geography
<p>In this term pupils will consider the basic needs of humans for survival (food, water, air), the need for warmth and shelter, and additional needs for health and wellbeing. They will also be introduced to the sequence of the human life cycle, first through considering how they have changed since birth.</p>	<p>In music pupils will be focusing their learning around the song "Hands, Feet, Heart". The children will explore an integrated approach to music where games, the interrelated dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc.), singing and playing instruments are all linked.</p>		<p>Children will identify what human and physical features make up their local area. Children will go on a trip to Grays to find some key features such as police station, a mosque, a church, a shopping mall and the River Thames.</p>

<p>Our units this term are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Understand place value in 2-digit numbers by creating 2-digit numbers. -Use language: equal to, more than, less/fewer than, most, least. -Use doubles and number bonds to add three 1-digit numbers. -Measure weight using standard or uniform non-standard units. - Draw a block graph where one square represents two units. - Double multiples of 10 and 5 (answers less than 100). - Double 2-digit numbers ending in 1, 2, 3 or 4 (answers less than 100). 	<p>This term our focus will be on managing changes as we grow. Children will be able to talk about ways in which they have changed since they were babies as well as identifying recent achievements. They will also know that change is a normal part of life and that sometimes we can plan for it and sometimes we can't. They will learn to name some emotions they or others might feel at particular times of change.</p>	<p>It is really important that your child comes to school every day and is ready to learn.</p> <p>Weekly homework to be completed and given to their class teacher on time.</p> <p>Children must read at home at least 4 times a week.</p>
