Well Davenport has come and gone and once again received more Memphis money. Last year I was the one returning with empty pockets and my 3T and now this year Calvin's pockets



were bare but he returned with a 1905 Indian. Hope you enjoy your Indian as much as I enjoy my 3T




If you have any news just let me know and I'll tell it on the grapevine.






GATHERING FOR GROUP PHOTO ON DAY ONE OF VICKSBURG


Calvin brought his 1905 for all to see. That bike is really something and in amazingly good condition to be so old.

We were all glad to see that Lee's four was back on the road and looking good after it caught fire last year.


The day was very enjoyable, not only the ride, but the opportunity to be with other bikers and enjoy their company.




Fleming Horne and Bill Northern enjoying

Thanks to Lee Rudd's help, the Confederate Chapter was invited to display our bikes at the annual bar-b-que cookoff in Bolivar on September 26th.


