Dear Fri<mark>ends</mark>,

Greetings to you in the holy name of the Lord Jesus Christ, our blessed Redeemer. As always, I trust God that you are in good health and continuing to grow in the grace and knowledge of the Lord Jesus. I also hope you are relishing in the joy of the Lord and enjoying spring.

By the time you read this message, the church will have moved into Easter Time - the 50 days in the liturgical calendar that begins at sunset on Resurrection Sunday and ends on Pentecost.

With the solemn and reflective Lenten Season and joyous occasion of Resurrection Sunday behind, Easter Time activities begin. At United, we will have about a two-week break between the end of Holy Week and the start of Easter Time endeavors - early morning prayer and Bible reading, Thursday evening service, and a monthly brunch with the UPC pastor.

Beginning May 2, from 6:00 AM– 6:15 AM, morning prayer and Bible study resume. Sunday morning is an addition to the morning schedule. Previously, early morning prayers ran Monday through Saturday.

Some benefits of praying and reading the Bible at the beginning of the day with other believers include reminding us we are members of the body of Christ possessing unique gifts bestowed on us by God for use in fulfilling God's divine will. Also, the discipline of engaging in early morning devotions helps center us spiritually. Thus, strengthening our resolve to remain Christ-centered throughout the day. It also helps us stay focused on God's power and keeps us from being overwhelmed by our daily personal challenges and concerns about the world's problems.

May 5 at 7:00 pm, our Thursday evening contemporary worship service resumes. We will continue analyzing the faith statements in the Presbyterian Church (USA) Book of Confessions.

Beginning Thursday, May 19, brunch with the UPC pastor begins from 11:00 AM-1:00 PM in Room 200 (Hansen Room) at UPC. Visit the church website and Facebook page for details. The trial period for monthly brunch with the UPC pastor runs from May through July. The event will start again on the third Thursday in September if participation is good during the trial.

In the spirit of 2 Corinthians 13:14, may the grace of God, the love of Jesus Christ, and the power of the Holy Spirit continue abiding with us.



National Day of Prayer



May 5, 2022

The **National Day of Prayer** is an annual day of observance held on the first Thursday of May, designated by the United States Congress, when people are asked "to turn to God in prayer and meditation". The president is required by law to sign a proclamation each year, encouraging all Americans to pray on this day.

The constitutionality of the National Day of Prayer was unsuccessfully challenged in court by the Freedom From Religion Foundation after their attempt was unanimously dismissed by a panel of a federal appellate court in April 2011.

HOW TO OBSERVE

People of many different faiths join in prayer on this day. Some will attend the church, synagogue, mosque, temple or monasteries of their choice to pray, others will attend interdenominational prayer events. Some will join prayer groups or meditate.

HISTORY

In the early 1950s, an evangelical movement called for Congress and the President to proclaim a National Day of Prayer.

The movement grew and a young leader, Evangelist Billy Graham, led services for approximately 20,000 on the steps of the Capitol on February 3, 1952. Later that year, Congress proclaimed a joint resolution for a National Day of Prayer. President Harry S. Truman proclaimed a National Day of Prayer to be observed on July 4, 1952. Each year since that date, Americans have observed the day in their own way. The observance moved to the first Thursday in May by President Ronald Reagan and has been proclaimed each year since. As a Nation, presidents and government officials have called for national days of prayer or thanks intermittently since before the country's existence.



ASCENSION OF THE LORD



The Christian holiday of Ascension Day, also known as the Feast of the Ascension, celebrates when Jesus ascended to heaven. This feast day is one of the ecumenical feasts of Christian churches, along with the celebrations of the Passion, Easter, and **Pentecost**. Ascension Day is generally observed on a Thursday, the fortieth day after Easter.

"No one has ascended into heaven except he who descended from heaven, the Son of Man." ~ John 3:13

Jesus' Ascension in Scripture

Forty days from the day He rose from the grave, Jesus ascended into heaven. Here is how Luke described the event:

Therefore, when they [the disciples and the risen Christ] had come together, they asked Him saying, "Lord, will You at this time restore the kingdom to Israel?"

And He said to them, "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority. But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and to the end of the earth. "Now when he had spoken these things, while they watched, He was taken up and a cloud received Him out of their sight..." (Acts 1:4-9, New King James Version).

Traditions of Ascension Day

Ascension Day always falls on the fortieth day from Easter and, since Easter always falls on a Sunday, Ascension Day always falls on a Thursday; it is frequently called "Holy Thursday."

Ascension Day celebrates Christ's exaltation. While on earth, He was a servant. Now in heaven, He is the ruler and Lord of all. By entering heaven as the representative of mankind, He completed the work of our salvation and guarantees the eventual glorification of all who love Him.

Just as Jesus went up in the clouds, He will return the same way. Again Luke described the scene:

"And while they looked steadfastly toward heaven as He went up, behold two men stood by them in white apparel, who also said, 'Men of Galilee, why do you stand gazing up into heaven? This same Jesus, who was taken up from you into heaven, will so come in like manner as you saw Him go into heaven.'"

The Importance of Jesus' Ascension

All of this should give us great encouragement! When feeling weak in ourselves, Luke reminds us that the exalted Christ has given us his Spirit, who equips us with the power, boldness, and courage we need to accomplish our mission.

This is the great hope of all Christians. For just as Jesus went into heaven, so will all Christians. Those who are dead will rise first; those who are living will be caught up to meet Him in the air, according to Paul, writing to the church at Thessalonica. With this hope in mind, Christians sometimes conclude their meetings with the words, "Come Lord Jesus."

Many volunteers place an American flag on graves of military personnel in national cemeteries. Memorial Day is also considered the unofficial beginning of summer in the United States.

The intercultural initiative calls for the PC(USA) to become a transformative church that is truly inclusive and genuinely appreciates each other's distinctiveness and differences. The initiative makes it clear that living in an intercultural society brings opportunities for the church to engage in effective and relevant ministries that model God's community, where mutual recognition and understanding of differences through self-examination, relationship-building and equitable access to power are not mere ideals but actual practices. Presbyterians are challenged to change by interacting and building deep relationships with people of different races and cultures, by educating in cultural humility and intercultural ministry, and by being involved in intercultural coalitions with other people of faith as allies, advocates and partners in making a reality the vision of becoming God's intercultural community.

One of the intercultural initiative's mandates is to urge all councils of the church, seminaries and other church entities to "take action to be intercultural in their life, work and worship." Yes, it is time for Presbyterians to take decisive action to become a transformative church in this intercultural era. We pray that this initiative may be the beginning of a new Reformation Movement in the church where all of God's people who have already come from the east, west, north and south sit together at the Lord's table and welcome one another as Christ has welcomed us.

The early Christians taught the gospel in private homes as well as in larger assemblies (Acts 5:42 and 20:20).

In some towns, private homes served as meeting places for smaller churches (Romans 16:5, 1Corinthians 16:19, Philemon 1:2).

At times when Christians arranged a meeting in a private home. It was simply a private gathering of neighbors, relatives, and friends. The most famous such "cottage meeting" was the one arranged by Cornelius at which Peter the Apostle was invited to speak (Acts 10:22-24).

1. *Homes Provide Opportunity:* Homes are a resource blessing enabling small churches, and Christian households in larger churches, to reach and teach.

2. Co-operating with the church: A "cottage meeting" should mesh with the program of the church proper, and have the blessing (and if necessary the guidance) of the church elders.



CHILDREN'S CORNER

Parents, please read this to your younger child(ren)

Breakfast on the Beach

Theme: Following Jesus brings great rewards

Object: Toy fishing nets - 1 per child; Plastic eggs - at least 1 per child; Stickers - 1 per plastic egg; Permanent marker; Assorted printed images; Paper Pencil

Scripture: John 21:1-19

Get Ready: Either draw or find and print each of the following images on a small piece of paper: (1) a group of male friends, (2) a boat, (3) a pile of fish, (4) a splash in a body of water, and (5) a campfire. Place each image inside a separate egg. Use the permanent marker to write numbers on the eggs with images in them, following the number scheme above. Then put a sticker inside each egg, except for the numbered eggs. Hold onto the extra stickers.

Do This: (Have kids sit in a circle.) Let's see what we can catch today. (Have kids use their nets to try to scoop up "fish" from the center of the empty circle.) Of course we didn't catch anything because there was nothing there to catch.

That reminds me about what we are learning from the Bible today. Jesus had died and come back to life on Easter. Later, Jesus' friends were out fishing, trying to make a living.

Jesus' friends fished all night and caught nothing. Then, they saw a man, not knowing it was Jesus, on the shore. Jesus yelled to them, asking, "Have you caught anything?" They didn't know the man was Jesus, but they still listened when He told them to cast their fishing nets on the right side of the boat.

(Spread out the eggs around the room, and tell kids to "catch the fish." Make sure everyone catches at least one. Tell kids not to open the eggs.)

You caught something! That's like what happened to Jesus' friends. Jesus' friends caught 153 fish! (Point out that there are numbers on some of the fish. Have kids come forward with the fish with a "1" on it. Explain that image symbolizes that Jesus' friends were together. Repeat with eggs two and three, inviting kids to tell what they think the image symbolizes from what you've covered in the Bible passage so far.)

There were so many fish that the friends couldn't pull in the fishing net. That's when Peter realized Jesus was the man yelling to them from the shore. (Have the child with the egg labeled four show the image in the fish and tell what he or she thinks it symbolizes.)

Peter was so excited when He realized Jesus had appeared again to them that He jumped into the water and swam to the shore where Jesus was!

The rest of the friends brought the boat to shore. (Have the child with the egg labeled five present the image in the fish and tell what he or she thinks it symbolizes.)

Jesus cooked breakfast over a campfire. Jesus' friends were reminded that day that following Jesus brings great rewards.

I think if you open up your "fish," you'll find a reward, too! (Allow time, and give a sticker to the kids who had the numbered fish.)

The disciples got to see Jesus and spend time with Him, and they ate the delicious breakfast He made for them

PRAY: Dear Father, we know that you have wonderful blessings in store for us when we follow Jesus. Our prayer is that we will always follow you. In Jesus' name, amen.
