NEIGHBORHOOD MEETING ~ May 21st at 6:30 PM Sand Replenishment & SB 50 Density Review


6:30pm Social Time and Refreshments Served Location: St. Mary's School, 515 Wisconsin Avenue

City subject matter expert Hans "Keil" Kroger will provide information and update on the dredging and scheduled sand replenishment for Oceanside beaches.

In addition, the State is considering an option to help create more housing by increasing density within ½ mile of transit locations with SB 50 legislation. We will review the key points of this Bill and the City's response to it.

ORDINANCE ON SHORT TERM RENTALS:



The OCNA Board supports the draft STR ordinance that would create more accountability for all and permit fees for corporate owners for a dedicated code enforcement officer. **75% of STR's are operated in the Coastal zone.** We were pleased when the Planning Commission approved an amendment to restrict STR in residential areas to owner occupied, except in the Residential Tourist zones. **A Council workshop is May 29 at 2PM**

DID YOU KNOW....

Oceanside is not alone in its beach erosion and sand shortage problems, as all American and international shores experience erosion. Wherever land meets ocean, erosion from waves and currents move sand from one place to another. Even famous Waikiki is struggling with beach sand erosion.

Rivers and creeks are the main source of beach sand. The San Luis Rey River was dammed in 1922 to create Lake Henshaw. Building dams created water for dry times but starved our beaches of needed sand.

By 1928 our once 300 foot wide beach was diminished to what was described as "usable beach was quite narrow." The last storm-flood that added notable amounts of sand to beaches was 1938! By 1941, severe storms battered our beaches and endangered houses with waves breaking over the end of the Pier!

In 1942 the Marines built the Boat Basin and the jetties disrupted the long-shore currents, as did the protected entrance of the new Harbor in 1963. Big storms in the 1980's took away much of the sand requiring moving rip rap along the Strand.

Today, we are fortunate to have sand dredging for "beach nourishment" performed at minimal cost to the city!
