Public Participation:

As Discussed:

- ➤ Pat Shedlock inquired about the proposed alley between Blueberry and Ryan Streets, Roadmaster is working with the new land owners and Penelec/Verizon concerning pole placement for electric and phone services. Road will be paved up to Ryan Street, Supervisors to review the budget, before the alley is completed.
 - Pat also inquired about the two dilapidated structures on Ryan Street;
 Supervisors are aware of the problem and would like to work with the land owners to rectify the situation.

- ➤ Keith & Patricia Shedlock Minor Subdivision Plan —Cambria County Planning Commission has reviewed the subdivision and a letter of correspondence informing Washington Township has satisfied the review requirements of the Act 247, Municipal Planning Code, with one review comment:

- o Section 22-508 of the townships subdivision and land development ordinance states the easements for sewer and water lines shall have a minimum width of 15 feet. The easement shown on the site plan between lots 1 and 2 is proposed to be 10 feet. If a waiver is granted, it should be noted on the plan.
- o Review by the township solicitor is required before any further action.
- This is the first subdivision reviewed by the Cambria County Planning Commission.
