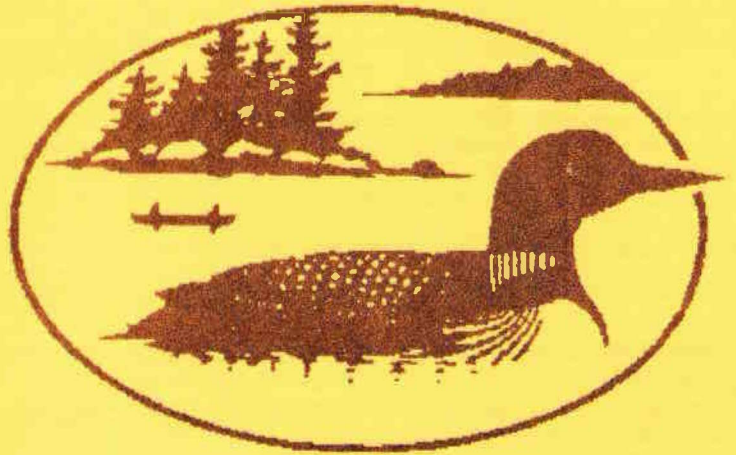

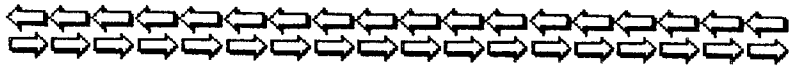

Odd Cricket requires you to close all the standard cricket numbers. You also score on closed numbers in the same manner. The difference is that you must also hit three triples, three doubles and three three-in-a-beds. You may have seen the strange extra blocks under the bull (T, D, B) at place like Hanks on the chalk boards, well these are for Odd Cricket.

One important thing to consider is that any number may be closed with three perfectly placed darts except the Beds...to close the

Beds, it requires at least nine darts. This is a good one to get out of the way early in the game.

ON THE ROAD

Remember if you don't go to the tournaments I can't write about you. I know it seems I write only about a handful of darters, that's because I do. I write about the 1% of all the area darters who attend these great events! I hope to hear about more of you real soon!

At the Great Lake Classics VI \$15,000 in Dearborn, Mich June 28-30 there are only two Dayton darters to report on. Brad Wethington & Bill Nicoll Jr. both finished in the top 16 in Open Singles 01. Then teaming up with Terry Carson & Randy Barker took top 8 in the 4 Person Team event.

On to Knobby Wighting Memorial \$8,030 Richfield, Ohio July 5-7. Bill Nicoll Jr. is only one I know who took money at the event. Top 8 in 501 Singles, and two 1st places. Mixed Trips with Tony Payne & Kathy Maloney and the other one was Draw Doubles 01, with John Holland as his partner.

And lets end up at the North American Open \$50,000 Las Vegas, Nevada August 16-18. You remember this one, its the one tournament no one takes their darts to.

Well surprise, our own city champ Bradley Wethington remembered to take his. As you should know Brad won this trip by finishing 1st at the ADO regionals. Congratulations Brad. But as a special bonus he gave his lovely lady Lisa the trip as her wedding present & Honeymoon. Congratulations again!

But when Brad finished throwing on the US All Stars team, he threw in the tournament taking a top 64 in Open Singles 01. This is no easy tournament, remember the best throw here every year.

The Windy City Open in Chicago, Illinois Sept 20-22 is also a \$50,000 tournament. Brad again finished top 64 in Open Singles 01. Doubling up with his long time partner, Frank Wolfe, they took top 16 in Doubles Cricket.

Once again I'd like to thank the Nicoll family & Dartboard Shoppe for another Dayton Dart Open. This gives more of our area darters a chance to strut their stuff.

At the Friday night LOTD, out of 108 entries, Brad Wethington/Jeff McKinney finished second. Top 4 was Frank Wolfe/Fred Ericks and Scott Buckley/Ron Allyn. Top 8 Hoa Harper/Debra Lewis, John Adams/Steve Hayslip, T16 Bob Hack/Jeff Gilbert, Tim Nicol/Robert Rushka, Doug Dietrick/Geo Ordel, Lou Lovash/Quag Meyer, Buck Itzkowitz/Moe Whelan, Paul Cooper/Gary Mawson.

There were 53 teams in Cricket Doubles. Bill Nicoll, Jr/Tony Payne won it all.

Out of 18 teams in Ladies Doubles 501, our own Tereasa Wahrab and Shell Hixson took top honors with Janet Itzkowitz and Mary Toney coming in at top 8.

Open Singles 501, 84 entries, we had three men finishing top 16, Rich(Homer) Skelton, Frank Wolfe & Chuck Weller.

Ladies Singles 501, 32 entries, T4 Kathy Kuykendahl, top 8 Mary Toney.

Open Cricket Singles, 76 entries, top 4 Brad Wethington, Top 16 Frank Wolfe, Mark Grencavage & Scott Buckley.

LOTD Cricket, the biggest of the tournament with 112 entries, Second place went to our own president Mark Grencavage when he was fortunate to team up with Daytons own Dave "O" Bennett. Smart darts...what are smart darts? To me it is some thought put into the shot beyond the immediately obvious. For example, smart darts in an 01 game would be to not only shoot the highest scores you can (obvious), but to set up a three dart out when you get below 200.

In Cricket, smart darts are thrown when you make it impossible for the opponent to end the game with his three darts...

smart darts will close a number by throwing a "fat" dart instead of aiming at the triple and missing to leave the number open for the opponent to score on.

In 501, smart darts are throwing at the 20 when you have 90 left, so you will still have a shot at a double without having to hit a triple (20, 20, double-bull).

These are all examples of smart darts. They are not always the most common shot for a given situation, but they increase your odds and may provide you with the opportunity to win.

Keep your fingers crossed for us we can use all the help we can get.

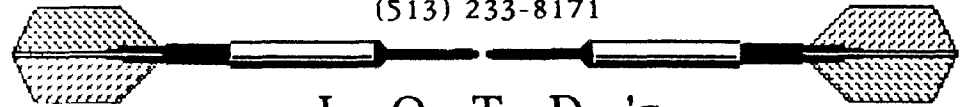

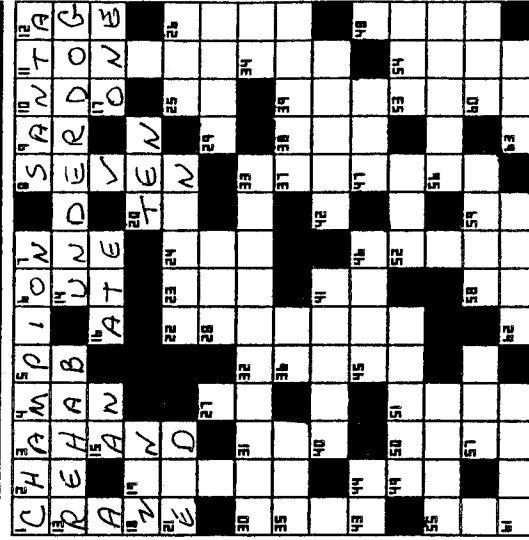

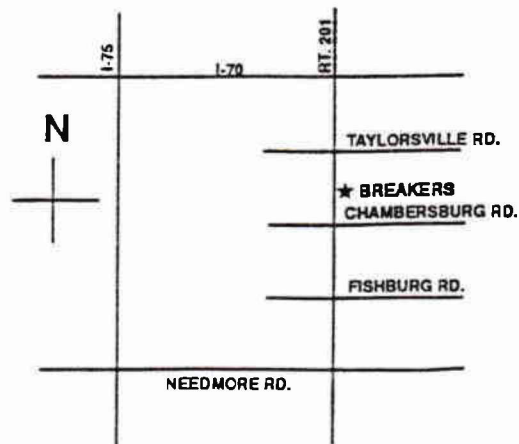
