WHAT IS PRAYER?

In a recent Bible Study, we talked about prayer. One of the questions I asked was, "What are some reasons that people pray?" And the answers were many and varied: "for the benefit of others", "to thank God for what we have" and "to confess our sins" were high on the list. But the other side of the "prayer coin" was also claimed- "to ask for what we want". Now, the person who lifted that up didn't present it as if they truly believed that was the real basis of prayer. Instead, they presented it as something we all struggle with in regard to prayer. And I would agree with that.

So what IS prayer? Is it a way to better connect to/with God...or is it a cosmic Christmas Wish List with God as Santa? Hopefully that last sentence made you smile! But prayer IS often seen as "asking God for what we want". So how do we combat that notion? How do we approach prayer in such a way that it stays grounded in the understanding of an ongoing conversation with God? There are MANY approaches to prayer, but one of my favorites is called the ACTS prayer.

Adoration- tell God how much you love Him.

Confession- share your sins with God, and ask His forgiveness.

Thanksgiving- thank God for all of the things He does in your life.

Supplication- ask God...1st on behalf of others, then on your own behalf.

I find this "formula" covers all the bases, if you will. And by the time I get to the end and ask God for things for myself, I realize that many of the things I wanted to ask for/about just aren't all that important! When we pray, we share the longings of our heart while also paying attention to what God's heart desires for our lives. It's NOT the least we can do- but the most! Prayer is a powerful thing. It is when we come to God and pour our heart out TO Him...and have it refilled BY Him.

CURRENT/NEW SERMON SERIES

On Sunday, September 11th, we began a brand new day! Along with the official launch of the new 9:15AM worship service, we also started a new sermon series- <u>Living A Red Letter Life</u>. In certain printings of the Bible, the words actually spoken by Jesus are printed in red- The Red Letter Edition. His words are powerful and life-changing. What if we intentionally built our lives around those red letter sayings? Each week of this 5-week series focuses on just that- what DID Jesus say and HOW does it apply to us? The remaining weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, October 2- God Values Children! (Matthew 19:13-15)

Be willing to sacrifice today so your children can have a better tomorrow. (Proverbs 22:6, Matthew 18:1-5) **Sunday, October 9- Are You Ready?** (Matthew 24:36-44)

Miracles come in moments- be ready and willing. (Proverbs 20:4-5, John 16:33)

Then, on Sunday, October 16, we begin a new series- Glory Days. Life has a way of taking the life out of us. Often we go through situations where the challenge seems so much greater than our strength. During such times, we can find hope and inspiration from the story of Joshua. God called him to lead the people from wilderness wandering to promise-believing. The same is true for us today. God is telling us that our best days—our "glory days"—are still ahead of us. We only need to grasp that truth and live in faith to realize this promise. The weeks of the series look like this:

Sunday, October 16- They're Waiting (Joshua 1:10-11)

Prepare yourself and step forward- these are the glory days. (Psalm 23, Philippians 4:4-7)

Sunday, October 23- Accept Your Inheritance (Joshua 1:1-4)

We must open our hearts to freely receive what God freely gives. (Jeremiah 29:13-14, John 1:12-1)

Sunday, October 30- Circle Jericho (Joshua 6:1-5)

The question isn't, "Will I face hard times?" but, "Will I face them alone?" (Genesis 28:15, Ephesians 6:10-13)

Sunday, November 6- Audacious Prayers (Joshua 10:12-14)

Our prayers need to be more frequent, more courageous and more powerful! (Proverbs 3:5-6, John 15:6-8)

Sunday, November 13- No Falling Words (Joshua 21:43-45)

In a world where trust is an endangered species, put your trust in God. (Genesis 12:6-9, Romans 8:31-39)

Sunday, November 20- God Fights for You (Joshua 1:5-9)

When you face challenges, be confident that God is your defender. (Psalm 103:1-5, Hebrews 13:5-6)

Come each week expecting God to speak to you in powerful ways!

After Midnight Gang

This morning I was reading Paul's Divine inspired letters to the people of Colossae. Throughout this New Testament book, Paul urges that Christ is to be kept first, and all we do is for the glory of God. He emphasizes the importance of remembering our completed state in Christ through His full forgiveness. Great Stuff!

My heart was particularly struck by Colossians 4; Paul writes about a man names Epaphras. Epaphras was a servant of Jesus Christ who came to Paul while he was imprisoned in Rome to share the positive progress of the people of Colossae. He remained in Rome as a fellow "prisoner." In verse 12, Paul shares the dedication of Epaphras to his friend as he relays, "He is always wrestling in prayer for you, that you may stand firm in all the will of God and fully assured."

This verse made me think of my "After Midnight Gang." Before your mind starts to wander, let me explain. I am blessed to have three friends that share a pact with me. If any one of the four of us needs a listening ear, loving thought, or moment of prayer even after midnight we are there to offer practical help based on our deep seated love. It's our commitment to each other, just as Epaphras remained faithful to the souls of Colossae. It is a powerful thing to receive bold assurance and spiritual care from people God handpicked for you. They are the hands and feet of Jesus. These acts are something for which we should always be thankful.

How about you? Do you have an after midnight group? If you do, I ask you to give them a word of thanks and to continue to "stand in the gap" through intercessory prayer for them. For all that we do will connect others to Christ.
