July 8, 2018 Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time Mark 6:1-6

Dear St. Pius X and St. Anthony Church Family,

Peace! Jesus quotes a proverb today in Mark 6:4, "A prophet is not without honor except in his native place and among his own kin and in his own house." Jesus' proverb gets to the same point as what business management folks call an 'expert', which is 'anyone who comes in from over 50 *miles away'*. Sometimes not being known by an audience allows a 'suspension of criticism' until time proves otherwise. So Jesus suggests that His rejection by his hometown is because He is one of them and too familiar. This happens to everyone! We humans have the tendency to overlook what is in plain sight and right in front of our eyes. We tend to see past what is overly familiar. Like the old song, "Don't know what you got until its gone!" Or think of the times that you go looking for your glasses when they are right on top of your head, or your pencil when it is behind your ear. They are so comfortable to us, that we fail to feel or see them. So because Jesus' crowd knows his upbringing and roots, they think they know everything about him. This leads them to reject and write-off what he says and does.

And this is so tragic, because it is completely their loss! We pray they came around later. Yet the reading says it was because of their closed-minds/hearts, that Jesus 'did not perform many miracles among them'. What I hear with that statement, is that Jesus did not perform many miracles with them, because no one asked him to. Over-familiarity leads to complacency. Could that happen to us? Maybe we have stopped asking, or looking for great things from God, because we have settled into stale routines of faith? Have we turned what could be dynamic faith experiences of wonder and awe at God's works, into simple religious 'motions' that we go through? Maybe because 'it is what I've always done', that I am missing out and shorting myself of more great 'Godexperiences'! Have we maybe pre-judged God and His Work, keeping Him in a box of our routines, and thereby missing all kinds of blessing? Something to pray about this week!
