SCHOOL BOARD NEWS

These are the UNOFFICIAL DRAFT MINUTES SUBJECT TO CHANGE AND BOARD APPROVAL, 2-6-102,104 MCA of the Regular October 17, 2016 School Board meeting:

- Chairman Lane Drury called the meeting to order at 8:00 p.m. Roll was taken and it was established that a quorum was present.
- Chairman Drury modified the agenda to move Action Item #15 – Waiver of School Use on Sunday – to the beginning of the meeting to accommodate students who were presenting the request.
- On motion by Bill Rask, seconded by Tim Tande, the minutes from the regular meeting on September 19, 2016, were approved unanimously as presented.
- Don Hagan moved to waive district policy and allow the FCCLA/BPA & JGM to hold a Chapter Service Project on Sunday, October 30, 2016 from 1-3 p.m. Bill Rask seconded and all present voted in favor.
- The superintendent's report was discussed and is attached and made a part of these minutes by reference.
- On motion by Jesse Cole, and seconded by Tim Tande, the September 11, 2016 – October 12, 2016 claims in the amount of \$67,857.36 were approved unanimously as presented.
- On motion by Jesse Cole and seconded by Don Hagan, the Activities Report for September 2016 was approved unanimously as presented.
- Don Hagan moved to cancel the following warrants: #37017 \$1.00 issued 2/7/13; #37255 \$1.05 issued 6/11/13; #37280 \$10.50 issued 6/11/13; Activity account: #7304 \$84.96 issued 9/25/15; #7363 \$75.00 issued 10/27/15 Bill Rask seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Jesse Cole moved to allow the Scobey Lions Club to sell 50/50 tickets at the home basketball games for the 2016-2017 season. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Bill Rask moved to include the following people on the substitute list for the 2016-2017 school year: Vada Henderson, Sherie Anderberg, Marjore Hersel, LeeAnn Danelson, Logan Chabot, Mark Chabot, Nicole Weltikol, Linda Hersel and Jacki Thievin. Don Hagan seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Tim Tande moved to hire the following sub-varsity coaches for the 2016-2017 winter sports: Assistant Boys Basketball: Kevin Nelson and Logan Hanson Assistant Girls Basketball: Tami Nelson and Dan Wang – volunteer only Jr. High Girls Basketball: Shalice Tommerup and McKenzie Kilgore Elementary Girls Basketball: McKenzie Kilgore Bill Rask seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Bill Rask moved to hire Teresa Turner for Cheerleader Advisor for the 2016-2017 winter season. Jesse Cole seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Don Hagan moved to award fuel purchases with 24-hour accessibility for gasoline, #1 and #2 diesel and regular delivery of propane to the lowest price at the time of purchase. Should prices be equal, purchases shall alternate between suppliers. Jesse Cole seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Jesse Cole moved to approve the first reading of the Teacher's Handbook for the 2016-2017 school year. Tim Tande seconded and all present voted in favor.
- Jesse Cole moved to purchase \$3,000.00 in volume credits from the Apple Volume Purchase program to be used to purchase Apps and e-books as needed. Bill Rask seconded and all present voted in favor.
- No action taken on the Opheim sports co-op request. There was no further business and the meeting was adjourned
