George H. Thomas

(1816-1870)

George H. Thomas, known to his men as "Pap" or "Old Slow Trot," was one of the Union Army's most brilliant corps commanders. A Virginian who stayed loyal to the Union he could conduct an almost indestructible defense on the battlefield, as he proved at Chickamauga. Later, he led his troops to take Missionary Ridge, marched with Sherman on Atlanta, and annihilated J. B. Hood's Army of Nashville.
