




MIGRATIONS

SOME HAVE ASKED—WHAT IS RCMA?

RCMA is one of our favorite charitable organizations and is mentioned several times in this newsletter. The following information is from the RCMA website.

Redlands Christian Migrant Association (RCMA) is a non-profit, non-sectarian organization that provides high quality child development services for farm workers families and other rural low income families in child care centers, family day care homes, after school dropout prevention programs and charter schools. RCMA enables families and children to participate fully in the same opportunities for education, health and social development that other Florida families enjoy.

RCMA serves low income families and supports them finding resources in the community to help them with food, supplies, getting Medicaid and support when there is a case of domestic violence. Parents do not pay for any services. RCMA provides three meals a day, diapers, books and education to prepare them for regular school.

PICKLED EGGS AND BEETS

My Grandmother always made them and they were a family favorite served on the veggie and cheese tray.

Ingredients

9 hard boiled eggs, peeled

1 can sliced beets with juice

4 T. white vinegar

2 T. pickling spice

1 T. sugar

3 whole cloves

Instructions

Place enough beet slices in bottom of a quart jar to cover.

Add 1 T. vinegar, 1 T. pickling spice, 1/2 T. sugar, 1 clove, and enough beet juice to cover.

Add 3 whole eggs and 1/2 C. water, then repeat layers until full.

Seal jar and turn upside down to blend all.

Place right side up in refrigerator for 3 days. So colorful cut in half and placed on your tray, or use these to make purple deviled eggs! These will keep for a week to 10 days.



TRISHA'S EGG SALAD

My own creation and another great use for all those Easter eggs!

Ingredients:

10 hard boiled eggs, peeled and cut into large chopped pieces

1 rib celery, sliced

8 green onions sliced (include some of the green tops)

Dressing:

1 1/2 C. mayo (I use Duke's)

1/2 C. sour cream

1 T. horseradish sauce

2 T. apple cider vinegar

3/4 C. crisp bacon crumbles

1/2 envelope dry ranch dressing/ dip mix

1/4 C. fresh dill, finely chopped Sea salt and course ground pepper, to taste



Instructions:

In a large bowl, combine the eggs, celery and green onions. Toss lightly.

In another bowl, make the dressing by whisking together the mayo, sour cream, horseradish sauce, vinegar, bacon, ranch mix, dill, salt and pepper. Add to eggs; mix together carefully until blended. Great served on toast with a slice of cheese (I use pepper jack), lettuce and a fresh tomato slice.

PEEPS® COCKTAIL

For adult Easter fun. Makes 1 drink

Ingredients

lemon wedge colored sugar 1 1/2 oz. cherry Vodka 1/2 oz. Triple Sec 3 oz. Half and Half 1 marshmallow PEEP

Instructions

Rim a martini glass with the lemon wedge and then dip the rim into colored sugar. Set aside.



To a shaker filled with ice, add the cherry vodka, triple sec, half and half until chilled. Shake and strain into prepared glass. Garnish with a Marshmallow PEEP. Serve immediately.
