#### FOOD FOR THE JOURNEY

Deut. 8:2-3, 14-16; 1Cor. 10:16-17; John 6:51-58

The cup of blessing that we bless is ... a participation in the blood of Christ...The bread that we break is ... a participation in the body of Christ.

The Church's Catechism teaches that, "The Eucharist is the source and summit of the Christian life. The other sacraments, and indeed all ecclesiastical ministries and works of the apostolate, are bound up with the Eucharist and are oriented toward it. For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ Himself, our Pasch...The Eucharist is the efficacious sign and sublime cause of that communion in the divine life and that unity of the people of God by which the Church is kept in being" (Catechism # 1324).

On Christmas Day we celebrate the Mystery of the Incarnation, when the Second Person in the Trinity, The Word of God, took flesh and became man, Jesus Christ. Today we celebrate the Mystery whereby Jesus Christ before departing this world gave Himself to you and me in the semblance of bread and wine, as His Body and Blood: "Take this...and eat: this is My Body...Take this...and drink from it: this is the cup of My Blood..."(Luke 22:17-20).

Summer is that time of the year when most people travel. A few years ago, when a majority of the airlines decided to no longer serve meals on the planes, there was an outrage and disappointment from potential passengers. Whether we travel by air, road or railway, our bodies need some liquid and /or snacks. The body needs food for the journey. Thus, most people often go with backpacks whenever they travel.

Christians are God's people on a journey here on earth. For us, the Eucharist is the "food for the journey - viaticum." The Body and Blood of Christ that you and I receive at Mass is the Real Food for the journey. Ours is surely a journey, which at times is met with challenges, temptations, desires, anxieties and difficulties. It is a journey often made difficult by the devil's tricks and deceits. We need faith, hope, wisdom, and most of all; we need both spiritual and physical strength for the journey. We will find all this when we partake in this true Food for the journey - the Viaticum, the Eucharist (Christ's Body and Blood). You and I need Him for our journey through life. Thus, the Lord Jesus says to you and me: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His Blood, you do not have life within you..."(John 6:53). The Eucharist, therefore, is our living Memorial. It is our life! Like the other Sacraments, the Eucharist is not just a Sunday event: It is the source and summit of all that we are and do as Catholics. As with all the Sacraments, the Eucharist accompanies us all the days of our lives.

Surely, the Eucharist is "the bread of angels, sent for pilgrims in their banishment. It is the bread meant for God's true children (you and me)..."(Sequence) The Eucharist is the bread meant for you and me as a genuine demonstration of our participation in the One Body of Christ. Our participation in this bread of the angels, the Body and Blood of Christ must always invigorate us to be agents of unity and harmony in our faith community; because as Apostle Paul puts it, "the loaf of bread is one, we though many, are one body, for we all partake of the one loaf" (1Cor. 10:17).






Registration for 2011 – 2012 **Religious Education Classes** for public school children, running September through June, is open. Classes are available for children

#### FEAST OF SS PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES, JUNE 29

#### (POPE BENEDICT XVI TURNS 60 IN THE PRIESTHOOD)

Saints Peter and Paul whose feast we celebrate on June 29 are great heroes of the Christian faith. They are the Princes of the Church. Apostle Peter, also known as Simon, was born in Galilee, a fisherman by profession. Jesus called him to "Come, follow Me, and I will make you fisher of people." He was poor and unlearned, but candid, eager, loving, and quick to embrace the Faith. In the New Testament Peter's name appears at least 160 times. When Jesus asked: "Who do you say that I am?" From Peter's lips came the spontaneous confession: "You are the Christ, the Son of the living God." Our Lord chose him as the chief shepherd of His church here on earth when He said: "You are Peter and on this rock I will build My Church...I will give you the keys of the kingdom of heaven..." The Lord further said to Peter on three occasions: "Feed My lambs"... "Tend My sheep"... "Feed My sheep"...Peter is the writer of two apostolic letters (Epistles) in the New Testament. The Scriptures do not record his death, but it is believed that he was martyred, crucified head downward, in Rome at the command of Emperor Nero.

Apostle Paul on the other hand, was born at Tarsus in Cilicia, of a father who was a Roman citizen. He was also from Jewish descent, of a very pious family where Pharisaic traditions and observances were practiced religiously. He was well educated at the school of Gamaliel and well versed in the scriptures. As a committed and zealous Pharisee, he persecuted the Church, and was converted while on his way to Damascus to kill those who followed Christ. The Lord appeared to him in a bright light and asked: "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me? ... I am the Christ Whom you are persecuting!" After his conversion, Paul worked zealously in promoting the Faith he once tried to destroy. He is known as the "Apostle of the Gentiles;" and he has written 13 epistles in the New Testament more than any other apostle. He suffered imprisonments, and was finally martyred also by Nero, who ordered that he be beheaded with a sword.

As we celebrate the lives of these great Princes of the Church, we pray for the successor of Saint Peter, **Pope Benedict XVI**, who celebrates his priestly ordination 60<sup>th</sup> anniversary this Wednesday, June 29. The Pope was ordained on this day in 1951. We ask God to bless him with good health in mind and body as he strive to serve God's people that Christ has entrusted to his care.
