Dear Church Family and Friends,

My son just returned from another year in the Namib Desert in Namibia – the country just north of South Africa. This was his second year in Africa. There are always many adjustments when he returns. Seven hours difference in time zones, cold moist air, closed windows, available technology, trees and green, different food, etc. One difference he mentioned that I hadn't thought about was the hours of daylight. Southern Africa is of course in the southern hemisphere and while our days are getting shorter, their days are getting longer. In a couple of weeks, we will have the shortest day of the year, while Africa will have the longest day. This got me thinking about our dark days of winter. There are many people in our latitude that never see the sun outside of working hours. It is often overcast even when it is daylight. This is a dark time of year. With all of this darkness there is something known as Season Affective Disorder or SAD. Science is not quite sure what the biological causes are, but it is definitely related to the lack of sunshine. The treatment for this disorder is light therapy or phototherapy which basically consists of sitting in front of a bright light with eyes open for 20-30 minutes each day. The results began in just a few days of treatment but the symptoms return when the light therapy stops. More light cures lack of light depression. What a simple answer! How much our spiritual body is like our biological body. At Christmas we celebrate the birthday of Jesus who is the light of the world. Jesus came to a spiritually dark world to shine the light of God's love. Our spiritual bodies can become sad and depressed when we don't get enough time with the light of the world. Just think what would happen if each person spent 20-30 minutes each day with eyes opened to the light of the world – reading scripture, praying and singing praise. This should be a goal for every follower of Jesus. When the light of God's love shines in you, others will want to be in the this light as well. Think about what the world would be if everyone was walking in the light of God's love!

Here are a few quotes from a website on SAD that also apply to the Light of the World.

"For most people, light therapy is most effective when it's done early in the morning, after you first wake up." "Light therapy requires time and consistency."

Make time for your own "Light" therapy. You can expect results within a few days. Try it. See what a difference it makes in your life!

May the Light of the World dwell with you and brighten all your days!
