News From Pastor Ryan:

Hello Friends,

If you know me, you know that the first weekend in February is an exciting one for me! Being a big football fan means the celebration of the unofficial holiday Super Bowl Sunday is one of my favorite days of the year! It's been made all the more special this year as it just so happens my favorite team, the San Francisco 49ers, will be playing. It's the BIG game!

One of the best parts of the Super Bowl is the stories told about each team. On the surface, the game is simple, two teams compete for points until a winner is declared. But an avid fan knows how much more goes into getting there. This year has several stories. One team has a coach who has had a Hall of Fame career but has come up short in the big game and can secure his legacy with a Super Bowl ring. The other coach is seeking redemption after his team blew a big lead in the Super Bowl a few years ago. There's a defensive player who had a devastating injury but fought back to top performance. We have two young quarterbacks trying to establish themselves as elite players. You have grizzled veteran's and fresh-faced rookies. All of them looking for their shot at football glory.

Did you know the Bible used several sports metaphors to talk about our faith? Paul specifically talks about how athletes are battling for temporary prizes, but Christians are fighting for an eternal prize.

"24 Do you not know that in a race all the runners run, but only one gets the prize? Run in such a way as to get the prize. 25 Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last, but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. 26 Therefore I do not run like someone running aimlessly; I do not fight like a boxer beating the air. 27 No, I strike a blow to my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize." -1 Corinthians 9:24-27

Paul gives us a reminder here that these big moments of sports glory, they will eventually be forgotten. Can you name all 53 Super Bowl MVPs? But the reward we receive in Christ, that lasts forever! So, if an athlete training for a temporary prize can be "all in" in their commitment, shouldn't we be MORE committed to our eternal prize? Shouldn't we dedicate our whole lives to the challenge that God has laid before us? We don't run aimlessly; God has given us a purpose. Love God, Love others.

When we see world class athletes, they are dedicating their entire lives to victory. They wake up early thinking about their goals. What they eat and drink furthers their cause. How they sleep is designed to enhance performance. Everything they do is in pursuit of the prize. Shouldn't we be the same? Shouldn't our faith be our focus from the time we wake up until the time we go to sleep? Paul says he makes his body a slave to the Gospel message. Just as an athlete's body is a finely tuned winning machine, we as Christians offer ourselves to God's calling completely! If we can be so dedicated to earthly prizes, let us be even more focused on eternal prizes!

Run your race! Love God and love others. Remember that the greatest prize is not a trophy or a medal, but the gift of eternal salvation in Jesus Christ.

FEBRUARY MISSION SPOTLIGHT

Our Mission Spotlight for the month of February is Crossroads Child and Family Services

Crossroad is a not-for-profit treatment provider for emotionally troubled children and their families. Behind that simple description is a long list of therapy, education, and family support services provided both to children who live on our campus and to those we work with in the community. Crossroad was founded by the German Reformed Church in the United States, a predecessor of today's United Church of Christ, in 1883 as "The Reformed Orphan's Home of Fort Wayne, Indiana." Crossroad maintains a care team featuring a chaplain, case managers, teachers, therapists, housekeepers, cooks, nurses, and others – working together to build Promising Futures for children. Children come to Crossroad through a variety of avenues. Judges, mental health professionals, public service agencies, counselors, and educators may refer children to Crossroad to receive services. Some youth come to us through and with their families. Crossroad provides many services to help meet the needs of these children and families, including: out-patient counseling services, community children's mental health programs, emergency mental health facilities, an alternative education academy, residential treatment, spiritual development, special education and recreation.
