

New Ordinances passed in 2018 that may interest you include:

- Ordinance #2018-27 As to golf carts; Any minor child on a golf cart should be seated in a forward-facing seat with safety restraint in place.
- Ordinance #2018-63 Outside storage of firewood located in rear or rear side yard, shall be neatly stacked and contained within an area not to exceed 32 square feet. The foregoing shall not limit the storage of firewood within an enclosed accessory building or vehicle.

Our upcoming projects in the Spring of 2019 include the following:

- Robinson Street Overlay which will begin at the southern Village limits and extend north to Church Street
- Design and Construction of a Parking Lot at the northeast corner of Robinson Street and Si Johnson-a joint agreement between the Village and the Robert Rowe Library
- A Safe Routes to School grant was applied for in 2018 and upon the receiving that award the Village intends to reconstruct 12 blocks of sidewalk in the southern portion of town along Grant Street, Barr Street and Bushnell Street. The awards are expected to be announced in March. Keep your fingers crossed!
- Main Street alley will be improved to alleviate current drainage problems
- Approximately 2,000 square foot of miscellaneous sidewalk construction and reconstruction will take place at our most critical locations in the spring
