

Sundrops

This Native perennial is an important wildlife plant. It blooms for almost two months in early summer and provides nectar and pollen to numerous pollinators. Butterflies and Hummingbirds will frequent the flowers and many birds will feed on the seeds. Also known as Narrow-Leaf Evening Primrose, it is host to 17 species of butterflies and moths as well as several specialist insects.



Oenothera fruticosa

- Hardiness: Zone 4-9
- Size: 1-2'
- Flower: Bright Yellow 2 " flowers in early Summer. Long bloom
- Culture: Prefers full sun and Average, well-drained soils. Drought-tolerant.
- Uses: Groundcover, meadow, Deer, salt and Drought tolerant, pollinators, butterflies, birds, hummingbirds, medicinal, edible
