#### **EUCHARIST: FOOD FOR OUR JOURNEY**

Gen. 14: 18-20; Psalm 110:1-4; 1Cor. 11:23-26; Luke 11-17

Last Sunday we celebrated the mystery of God revealing Himself to us as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Today we celebrate the mystery of God giving Himself to us in the semblance of Bread and Wine. This is a feast, which almost seems like an appendix to the solemn liturgy of Holy Thursday and solemnizes what we believe and celebrate in every liturgy. In this feast we are commemorating the command of Christ: "...Do this in memory of me", when He gives us His

and blood in the words the priest says at Mass: "Take body this...and eat: this is my body...Take this... and drink from it: this is the cup of my blood..."

This feast, originated in the visions of St. Juliana of Mount Cornillon in the mid-13th century, was first celebrated as a local feast, but in 1264, Pope Urban IV extended it to the whole Church and it quickly spread throughout Christendom as a processional feast. It's a pity that the practice of processing with the Eucharist has gradually faded away in many of the dioceses around the world in recent times.

In today's feast in which we relive the first Sacred Supper, with a public and solemn act, we glorify and adore the bread and the wine, which becomes the true Body and true Blood of the Redeemer. In his homily on the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ in 2002, Pope John Paul II said: "Today we are celebrating a solemn feast that expresses the awesome wonder of the People of God: a wonder filled with gratitude for the gift of the Eucharist. In the Sacrament of the Altar, Jesus wanted to perpetuate His living presence in our midst in the same form in which He gave Himself to the Apostles in the Upper Room. He left to us what He did at the Last Supper and we faithfully renew His action." Indeed, we are the Pilgrim People of God (the Church), for whom the Eucharist (Body and Blood of Christ) is a viaticum, as the manna was for the Israelites. In the Eucharist, Christ, through the eternal Spirit, offered Himself unblemished to God, in order to cleanse our conscience from sinful works, so that we may truly worship the living God.

We are on a journey through life - a journey filled with desires, anxieties, temptations, hardships, stresses, disappointments, discouragements and difficulties. We are on a journey surrounded by the devil and his deceits. We need faith, hope, vision and most of all we need both spiritual and physical strength for the journey. We will find all this when we have the true Food for the journey (Viaticum), Holy Communion. We need to feed our spirits with spiritual food as we feed our bodies with regular food; thus, we come to Mass to be fed. You and I need the Eucharist (Holy Communion) for our journey through life. Thus, the Lord says to us: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you..." (John 6:53). The Eucharist, therefore, is our living Memorial. As Vatican II Council says: "In the Eucharist, is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ, our Pasch, and the living bread which gives life to all peoples through His flesh..."

Like the other Sacraments, the Eucharist is not just a Sunday event: everything we are and do as Catholics is rooted in the Eucharist, as all the Sacraments accompany us all the days of our lives. Indeed, it is "the bread of angels, sent for pilgrims (you and me) in their banishment. It is the bread meant for God's true children..."
