Don't Be Caught Unawares!



Today's parable of the wise and foolish bridesmaid is unique to Matthew's Gospel. It both intensifies and personalizes the warning tone that recurs throughout Matthew's parables. While not minimizing the parable's unsettling, even ominous tone, isn't there something truly poignant, almost heartbreaking in its

message? To all appearance, the bridesmaids are alike. All ten bridesmaids have the lamps they were given, interpreted by some commentators as the gift of faith or perhaps the grace of membership in the Church. But only five were wise enough to bring oil, that is, to do their share with what they have been given. Oil represents loving deeds, just actions, faithful witnessing.

Then suddenly, the Bridegroom returns, a decisive moment for those prepared, and even more so for those unprepared. For now the time of repentance has passed, the door is barred, and the feast has begun. Although those unprepared know the Bridegroom's true identity - "Lord, Lord" (Matthew 25:11) - the Bridegroom does not recognize them.

What of ourselves? Where would we be if He came right now? Inside or out? Would tomorrow be any better than all of the tomorrows we've already had? What of our lamps? Recall the fragile, flickering flame bestowed at baptism with the admonition that it be kept burning brightly. That flame is nourished by Wisdom, the first reading's gracious lady who comes "seeking ... with all solicitude" those who diligently and vigilantly seek her (Wisdom 6:61). As the "consolation" Paul alludes to in today's second reading consider this: Though today's Gospel portrays the real possibility of an unhappy ending, for those of us still able to hear the warning our ending has not yet been written. God leaves that writing to us. What are we waiting for?

STEWARDSHIP SUNDAY

The word "**stewardship**" is often invoked in religious circles to encourage members to be supportive of their congregation. That usually includes the contribution of financial support along with a commitment of time to assist in the work or ministry of the community.



At its root, stewardship implies the responsible overseeing and protection of something worth caring for. In a congregation, true stewardship is a reciprocal relationship. It is very much like a covenantal relationship between God and His people as described in the Bible. A faithful steward recognizes that what one has is not one's own possession. It is a gift, meant to be treasured, preserved, and used for the benefit of others. In turn, the community responds with care and support in time of need, because it too is a steward of the resources it has been given.
