Tuesday, April 25 --- Illinois Women March on Springfield

Rally at noon on Second Street in front of the Illinois State Capitol; at 12:45 there will be a march and lobbying around the Capitol Complex; at 1:30 lobbying continues inside the Capitol and Stratton buildings; at 2:30 a final rally will be in the Capitol rotunda. We are joining more than 100 coalition partners from across the state. AAUW will have a tabling event with AAUW and legislative information from 10 until 3 in the rotunda area.

Lobbying will emphasize select bills in twelve issue areas grouped under a theme of "**Progressive Agenda and Responsible Budget.**" Participants are encouraged to select a couple of bills for any of the issues and to personally lobby or phone their legislators for action. Issues are:

- 1) Women's Agenda (women's health, sick time, equal pay)
- 2) People's Agenda/Labor (child care and wages)
- 3) Gun Safety
- 4) Homelessness and Hunger
- 5) Civil Rights, LGBTQ, Voting Rights
- 6) Police, criminal justice, re-entry
- 7) Environment

- 8) Immigration
- 9) Healthcare
- 10) Budget (general push, social services, domestic violence)
- 11) Economic Issues (child care, housing)
- 12) Education (special ed services)

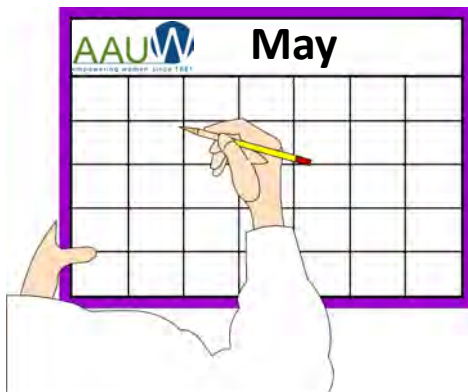

She thanked Lisa Cherry, from the Gender Equity Fund speakers' bureau, for coming to present the program and introduced new member, Linda Lobue.

Approval of Minutes – Branch Meeting of March 9, 2017 (printed in the April 2017 *Branchline*)
