A Report of the District Evangelistic Work By Lillian P. Greer, in Charge.

What hath God wrought! After two and a half years absence from the field I returned to find a revival sweeping over it, bringing newness of life to dead churches as well as to our Bible women and pastors, thus welding them and their flocks into a bond of brotherly love that has never before existed.

It has been a year such as I never dreamed of experiencing, for long had I felt that the day of miracles was past and that the Acts would never be re-acted. But it has been my inexpressible joy to witness the Holy Spirit manifest Himself in many exact duplications of those recorded in the history of the early church. The harmony and oneness of purpose among the workers has made it possible for us to spend more time in evangelistic work and less in supervising.

Since there was no fourth year class this year in the Bible Training School, Miss Ching was released for the country evangelistic work. The Lord was good to give me such a devoted and experienced worker, for many phases of this revival, tho new to me were not to her.

There is an evident hunger and openess to the Gospel everywhere among people of all ages, and the confession of sins turning from them and trusting the Lord Jesus for salvation is not confined to older people, nor is the desire to serve Jesus and the willingness to suffer persecution. One little girl, converted one evening, told the next evening of the persecushe had endured during the day because she could not enter into the gambling games with her playmates as had been her want. When asked how she had overcome the temptation she said she went to the home of another girl who had just been saved and together they prayed for their playmates. One young girl led her widowed mother to the Lord through patiently enduring her violent temper attacks when intoxicated, and the tender care she gave a baby brother, the only son. The baby was scalded on both hands and feet and could not be quieted except through prayers of the sister who, when she went to pray, carried him

to the church in one of the village homes. The mother was convinced that Jesus does hear and answer prayer and accepted Him as her Saviour. There was great rejoicing among the Christians of that village for all had been praying for this mother.

The simple faith and trust in God of these new converts is a challenge to us. A widow just converted this spring was persecuted by her neighbors because she continued to keep the Sabbath and worshipped a God who put more rust on her wheat, they tauntingly affirmed, than on that of her unbelieving neighbors. She told them her Heavenly Father would feed her some way, even though all her wheat was taken by rust. Hers was the first to ripen and consequently harvest hands were secured at a much lower price than her neighbors had to pay later. A few of them commented on this difference in price, but not until her peanuts and "tall grain" flourished beyond any previous year, and noticeably beyond similar fields of her neighbors, did her persecutors confess that her God was a living and powerful one. One came to inquire how many cakes of bean fertilizer she had used on her field of "tall grain." When told that she had not been able to buy any at all he said, "I used five on my field adjacent to yours, but my grain is not nearly so good as yours. Your God surely is taking care of you." She told me this as we walked through her field of grain. When she had finished she said humbly, "Let us return to the house and together thank the Heavenly Father for the care He takes of His own."

The numerous occasions of prayer for the sick and afflicted, or for those who are striving to overcome the gambling, opium, or drink habit, gave us opportunities to bring whole families to the Lord. Last week a young man told me he was home to see his mother, an invalid, a paralytic not being able to rise from her bed for more than a year, who after accepting Jesus as her Saviour and Healer, was now doing her own housework. He confessed he had doubted her healing until he saw for himself. I asked him if he ever heard of Jesus before his family wrote him. "No," was his reply, "but I believe Him now after seeing the wonderful things He has done for my mother and other members of my family. When I return to my work I shall look up a church where I can learn more about Jesus."

Revivals have been held in several homes, the above mentioned being one where blessings have come through prayers for the sick. These homes are now meeting places for the new Christians. The many remarkable conversions followed by a passion to win others to Jesus are features of the revival which stamp it as absolutely genuine.

A young man of our own city who had wrecked his father's business through losses in gambling, was led to the Lord by a relative who assured him that Jesus would take away the desire to gamble. The young man in his testimony a few evenings later, explained how he desired to be a filial and obedient son, but did not have the strength to overcome the temptation until he believed in Jesus who gave him immediate and complete victory, and that not from the afternoon when he confessed his sins and took Christ as his Saviour, had he once had the slightest desire to gamble. On the other hand, he was repelled by the thought when his friends invited him to join them in a game. He witnesses everywhere he goes to the power of blood to cleanse from sin, and has a great love for the sick who send for him to pray for them. He has great power in prayer and has led many to the Lord.

The wonderful miracles God has permitted me to behold and the fruits of the Spirit as I have seen them manifested in the lives of so many of our workers have made me hungry for a deeper experience in the Lord, and for a deeper conviction of the power of the Cross, so that I can say with Paul, "I am not ashamed of the Gospel, for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believeth."
