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Vaccinations for Cats

Here is a schedule as to when cats should receive vaccines:

Cat Vaccination Schedule	
Age	Vaccination
7-8 weeks	Combination Vaccine* or BOOSTER
10 weeks	Combination vaccine or Booster
12 weeks or older	Rabies: Given by your local veterinarian (age at vaccination may vary according to local law).
13 weeks	Combination vaccine or Booster
Adult (boosters)**	Combination vaccine FeLV: for cats at risk of exposure to feline leukemia virus. Rabies: Given by your local veterinarian (time interval between vaccinations may vary according to law).
*A combination vaccine includes feline distemper, rhinotracheitis, and calicivirus. Some may also include Chlamydomphila.	

Always take your cat to a Veterinarian for a check up! He/She will be able to make sure that your kitten or cat is healthy for vaccinations.

If you are having financial difficulties, and if your cat is an inside cat only, you may be able to skip a vaccine as your cat gets older. However, YOU MUST consult with a veterinarian to make this decision!!

Make sure that your kitten receives all vaccines in its first few years of life. This will help keep him healthy for a long time.
