

27th Sunday in Ordinary Time Sunday 8 October 2023 (Year A) How's Our Vineyard Doing?

The image of a vineyard was a common analogy for the people of Israel under the care of a loving, nurturing and faithful God. It joins today's first reading with the gospel. Those who have lived in vine-growing areas or who grow vines will identify with preparing soil, planning, pruning and regular tending the vines and, if successful, harvesting the grapes for wine making and sharing.

The first reading is an oracle addressed to God's people at a time when the divided kingdom of Israel was under the yoke of an oppressive conqueror. Attributed to the prophet Isaiah, it is a parable of the times known as the Vineyard Song.

In spite of the best of care by the owner/gardener, the vines yield sour grapes. What more can he do? The fences are knocked down and the carefully planted rows of vines are allowed to grow wild. They have not responded to the care given to them. Having told the story, the prophet turns to his audience and explains its relevance. Israel is the Vineyard lovingly tended by the God, giving them every opportunity to respond in faithfulness to the covenant. From them he expected justice and integrity but all he could perceive was hardness of heart and injustice in their dealings which was a betrayal of the spirit of the covenant.

In the gospel of Matthew today the analogy of the vineyard is used by Jesus. This time the grapes reach harvest time in fine condition but the 'managers' of the vineyard in the absence of the Owner are untrustworthy. They act as if they are the owners and they decide to reap the benefits of the harvest to the extent of killing the servants who are sent to convey the wishes of the owner. The owner hasn't given up on them yet. He says to himself, "They'll respect my son". So he sends the Son but he too will suffer.

At the time of the writing of the Gospel the parable was most likely a response to the perceived 'hard- hearted' of leaders and others who rejected Jesus and those who, proclaiming Him as God's anointed, followed Him. The temptation is to read this story as a condemnation of another people in another time but that's not why it is proclaimed in our Sunday Eucharist.

When we assemble as a community we are reminded that it is the risen Lord who draws us together and is present with us. He blesses us with forgiveness and strengthens us through the Eucharist, yet He is also calling us to assess our participation in His mission for it to bear fruit in Christian living.

The question becomes for us: how are we and our leaders shaping up as tenants entrusted with the care of our planet and through our interactions, inclusion and care of others with the care and nurturing of our immediate communities – family, neighbourhood, parish, shared world?

As One in the Body of Christ are we people of integrity and compassion giving priority to the weak, the innocent and vulnerable amongst us. Are we striving for a more inclusive, open church in which responsibilities are shared and the talents and experiences of all are nurtured, welcomed and allowed to grow? Are we able to recognize those moments of grace that might usher new beginnings for our faith community and opportunities for reconciliation with God and neighbour in which God is saying: They will respect my Son."

Jesus might come to us in unexpected ways: in the advice of a friend or family member; in the tragic story of a betrayed or abused child; through the 'thank you!' of a refugee asylum seeker or the plea of a homeless neighbour. Let us look at the vineyard we have been given. Are we progressing as good tenants?

Voice to Parliament Australian Referendum 2023

What is the Voice to Parliament referendum about?

The Voice to Parliament is something very practical and simple: it is an advisory body that will provide expert advice to Parliament about laws and policies that affect Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. A Voice to Parliament will give First Nations Peoples a say about what really works in their communities. It's about recognition and participation. A referendum is needed to change Australia's constitution. The referendum will ask a very simple question: Should we recognise Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people in the Constitution with a Voice? A simple question with a simple answer: Yes or No.

What are Catholic religious leaders saying about the Voice?

The Church does not tell us how we should vote. It encourages everyone within the Catholic community to make their own informed decision by reading the Uluru Statement from the Heart and also the official Australian Electoral Commission document covering the yes and no positions.

Earlier this year, the Australian Catholic Bishops Conference and the National Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Catholic Council (NATSICC) made a joint statement about the Voice:

"Australians have an opportunity to begin a new chapter this year with the referendum on the Voice to Parliament. We in NATSICC know there are criticisms, even from Aboriginal people, but most Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people support the referendum. Just as the churches strongly supported the 1967 referendum, we hope that Catholics, along with other people of faith, will support the Yes campaign." Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son" he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' and it is wonderful to see?

'I tell you, then, that the kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.' The Gospel of the Lord.
