Feast of the Assumption of the Holy Mother-of-God

The Feast of the Assumption of the Holy Mother-of-God is a non-variable commemoration and the oldest of all those dedicated to St. Mary. The Armenian Church celebrates this feast day on the nearest Sunday to August 15, a practice adopted at the time of St. Nerses the Graceful.

Assumption comprises a week of fasting, Navagadik, and a Memorial Day. In the early centuries, the observance took place over the course of three days; but as arranged by Shnorhali, it was extended to nine days.

In the Holy Bible, there is little information concerning the details of St. Mary's life. As a result, the story of her Assumption has been preserved and passed on to us through the Holy and Sacred Tradition of the Apostolic Church.

According to tradition, following the Ascension of Christ, Mary lived out the rest of her days in Jerusalem, cared for by St. John the Evangelist. She died in Jerusalem some 15 years after Christ's Ascension and was buried in her family tomb in Gethsemane.

After she passed away, all the apostles, save Bartholomew who was absent at that time, conducted her funeral with great ceremony at a cave-like tomb in the Garden of Gethsemane. Later, St. Bartholomew returned and wished to see Mary one last time.

He convinced the apostles to open the tomb, but they could not find her body inside. Angels' voices were heard for three days and nights. The apostles interpreted the angels' singing as a sign that our Lord had assumed, or taken up, his mother into heaven as he had promised her.

They found the empty tomb a confirmation of that promise for she had not been dead, but had fallen asleep. For this reason, the church refers to the end of Mary's earthly life as "the dormition" rather than "death."

The tradition concerning the dormition of the Holy Mother did not become a basic teaching (doctrine) of the church until the 9th century, and it wasn't until the 12th century that the feast was titled "the Assumption.

Choreg wrap up: Saturday July 8. Laurie Menendian and Debbie Sheklian chaired the affair. Debbie and Myron Sheklian arrived at 7AM to mix and knead the dough with the big mixer machine in the hall. About 9:00, the rest of the team streamed in. Laurie Menendian and sister Mari Louise Menendian and sister-in-law Ardemis Menendian, Margie L. The dough is cut into size for a single choreg, then rolled long and thin with our palms. The trick is braiding into the familiar final form. Menendians learned it from Der Shahe Altounian's Yeretsgin Mary. It's an art. Everybody got pretty good at it. Baste with egg and into the oven for 20 minutes. We ended up with about 50 dozen, bagged and frozen. Unfortunately, (fortunately?), one tray went into the oven without the egg wash. Got to have that egg wash. So we got to taste the result of our labor! Delicious! We were done by 11:00!

Yettem saves the day: What's camp without choreg? Another church made choreg for the first week but they added sesame seeds, an allergy issue. Hye Camp Committee was relieved and delighted to learn that our day to make choreg, sans sesame seeds and sev gundig, was the day before the first week started July 9. Olivia Garabedian of the Committee took our choreg up to camp just in time for the young campers.

Biographical Highlight

Edvard Abgaryan was born on April 20, 1984 in the village of Aghavnatun in Armenia's Armavir province.

From 1990 to 2001 he attended school #3 in Metsamor. From 2002 to 2004, Edvard served in the Armenian Armed Forces.

In 2004, he was admitted to the Gevorgian Theological Seminary of Holy Etchmiadzin, receiving a Bachelor of Arts degree in 2008. On December 25, 2008, the Feast of St. Stephen the Protodeacon, he was ordained as a deacon by H.E. Abp. Ararat Kaltakjyan.

Deacon Edvard graduated from the Gevorgian Theological Seminary in 2010 with a Master of Arts degree. On October 31, 2010, he was ordained as a celibate priest by Bishop Mkrtich Proshyan and was given the priestly name Yeremia.

From 2010 to 2011 he has served as the secretary at the Church and State Relationship Department of the Chancellery of the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin. He headed the department from 2011 to 2015.

Throughout the Primacy of Archbishop Hovnan Derderian, a number of priests from the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin, the Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem and various dioceses around the world have been invited to continue their pastoral service at the Western Diocese.

The Very Rev. Fr. Yeremia Abgaryan is the newest priest who has been invited by the Diocesan Primate to serve at the Western Diocese. With the blessings of His Holiness Karekin II, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, Father Yeremia (baptismal name Edvard) arrived in Los Angeles from the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadzin on September 10, 2016.

Father Yeremia, will attend a theological university to further his education. Meanwhile, at the Primate's directive, he will serve as a visiting priest.

We will extend a wholehearted welcome on Saint Mary day in the Yettem to the Very Rev. Fr. Yeremia Abgaryan.



On the Feast of the Assumption of St. Mary, the Ceremony of the Blessing of the Grapes is conducted, and the harvest for the entire year is blessed on that day.

The Armenian Church has a deep and abiding respect towards St. Mary. Special emphasis is placed on her being a mother, her honesty, her unique spirit of humility, her virtuous behavior and her unselfish dedication. For Armenian women, the Holy Virgin is the embodiment of virtue, pious motherhood, and the protector of family sacredness.

The Blessing of Grapes | Khaghogh Orhnek

On the Feast of the Assumption, the blessing of grapes takes place immediately after the Divine Liturgy. The ceremony is rich in symbolism and emphasizes the important role the Virgin Mary assumed in the revelation of God.

The custom of blessing grapes, the first fruits of the harvest, can be traced back to Old Testament times, when farming was a common vocation. Of the vast variety of produce, grapes had a special place of honor and were considered the "first fruits" because they were the first produce of harvest.

Among the Israelites, as among many neighboring cultures, grapes were regarded as belonging in a special way to God since they were the first fruits. It was He who gave the gift of the whole harvest and to offer Him the first fruits was to acknowledge complete dependence on Him. Special services of thanksgiving were conducted by priests in the temple, a tradition that prevailed to the time of Christ.

With the birth of Jesus, these dedications took on a new meaning. Jesus Christ was the first born or the first fruit of Mary and, as such, was offered to God in the temple. (Luke 2:25-30)

Armenian Church doctrine teaches that Mary has a primary place of honor because it was of her and by the Holy Spirit that God became incarnate (took human flesh). She is seen as the image of humanity fully obedient to God and ultimately sanctified by doing God's will. Therefore, on the feast remembering her dormition (falling asleep in Christ) and Assumption (ascending to heaven), we celebrate the blessing of grapes.

Christ gave His blood to us for eternal life, and in remembrance we bless the grapes, the fruits of the earth.

It is traditional to use seedless grapes to emphasize that this fruit came into being without seed, just as Christ became man without any human agent.
