Residential Security Tips

- **★** Keep valuables in another room(s) besides the master bedroom.
- ★ Mark (engrave) all valuables with your drivers' license number. Inventory your valuables including serial number, model number and date purchased and keep in a secure location. Photograph or videotape your valuables. (Attachment 13)
- * Routinely check the back-up battery on your smoke detectors.
- * Keep doors and windows locked, even if you're in the backyard.
- * Keep your keys secured at all times.
- ★ Never mark your keys with any kind of identification so they can be traced to you.
- ★ Never hide a key outside your home burglars often know the places to look
- **★** If your keys are lost or stolen have the locks re-keyed
- ★ Do not place large rocks or other items near windows or doors. These can provide the burglar with his tools.
- **★** Remove keys from your vehicle even though it is inside the garage.
- * Keep vehicles locked. Also keep garage door opener and any valuables out of view.
- ★ Do not use your full name on your mailbox, in the telephone directory, or on your answering machine.
- ★ Check and see who is at the door before opening it and do not open the door to an unexpected visitor.
- * As for photo identification of all repair persons. If you are suspicious, call to verify employment.
- * Vary your routine.
- * If you have a home security system make sure you are familiar with it's operation and always set it prior to retiring for the evening or leaving the residence, etc.
- **★** Never give personal information to telephone solicitors.
- ★ Consider creating a "safe room" with a separate telephone line or cellular phone, and strong locks. If someone breaks in, you can retreat there and call for help.
- **★** Do not let strangers into your home to use the telephone. Offer to make the call for them.
- **★** Do not leave a note on the door letting someone know you'll be "right back", etc.
- * Always be AWARE of what is going on around you.
- ★ If something or someone makes you feel uncomfortable or appears suspicious report it to Law Enforcement immediately.
