
Meetings:

Monthly Meeting Minutes

September 2022 Meeting Report

We held our September meeting at Ottawa State Park. The weather was sunny and comfortable for our annual picnic at the beach. Almost 40 members attended the picnic, bringing multitudes of side dishes and desserts to go with the club-provided hotdogs and hamburgers. No one went home hungry.

Immediately following our dinner, Treasurer Linda Walker presented \$1200 checks to both Holland Hospice, and to Be Nice. The representative from Holland Hospice noted that our club has donated over \$15,000 to them. We've donated generously to Be Nice too. This is something our club should be very proud about.

Scott VanTamelen gave us an update on our upcoming Fall Cruise. It will no longer be a two-day cruise. The hotel was not able to give us a deal on rooms, so a one-day cruise it is now. Scott has some ideas for places to visit. Details will be mentioned elsewhere in this newsletter. We will probably meet up somewhere in the Spring Lake/Grand Haven area. Scott will email any updates as they happen.

Linda Walker reported facts and figures of our August 12th Car Show. We had a record turnout of 178 paid registrations! Plus, over 22 WMPOCI member cars! That's the first time we put over 200 cars on the Elhart car lot. Linda reported Car Show income of \$3055, and expenses totaling \$571.42, leaving us a net profit of \$2483.58. (This allowed us to donate \$1200 each to Holland Hospice and Be Nice.) We had more trophies to give out this year, 20 in all. However, the Grand Prix trophy was unclaimed since there were none in attendance.

Linda also passed out her Treasurer's Report. We had income from club dues and the car show. Expenses included the ice cream for our August meeting, and for the car show.

Where we will meet for our October meeting still has to be determined. See elsewhere in this newsletter for the location. Officer nominations will be held, which leads us to...

Scott suggested that the club consider paying the officer's dues as an incentive for more people to run for the various positions. It was decided to vote on it at the next meeting.

Also, Scott talked about the importance of chapter members being members of POCI too. Fortunately, it's not a problem for our chapter.


The November meeting will be held at the VanZytveld "cave". We will hold our officer elections and our annal Valve Cover Races.

I look forward to seeing you all at the October meeting.


