We're go - in' to the zoo, zoo, zoo. How a-bout you, you, you?



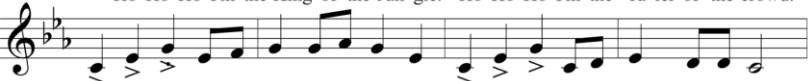
You can come too, too, too. We're go - in' to the zoo.

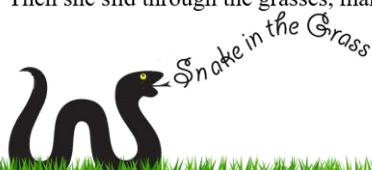

I will rock you, rock you, rock you, I will rock you, rock you, rock you.



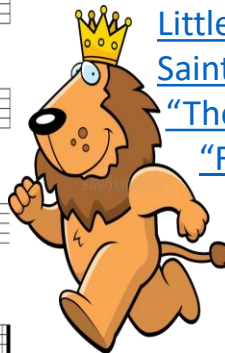

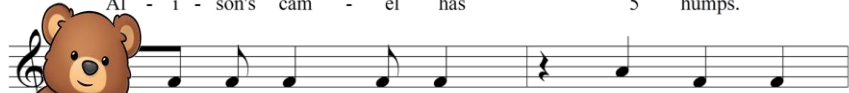
Alison's Camel

For I'd have fur boots and a brown fur cap And brown fur knick-ers and a big fur cap.

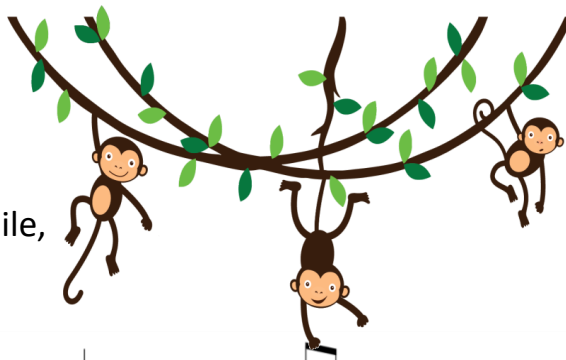


I'd have a fur muf-fie ruff to cov-er my jaws and brown fur mit-tens on my big brown paws.
