For thousands of years, Indigenous people have walked in this land. As we gather for worship this morning, we acknowledge that we are gathered in the traditional territory of the Saulteaux, Cree, Dakota, Lakota, & Nakota First Nations and the traditional lands of the Metis, now defined as Treaty 4, and we acknowledge their stewardship of this land throughout the ages. We recognize this statement in itself is not reconciliation work - this stand-alone acknowledgment must be accompanied by multiple acts that continue to deepen our understanding of the connections between Indigenous peoples and the lands on which we are joined through the course of history and through treaty signing.



Immanuel Anglican will be hosting a Kairos Blanket Exercise. All are welcome. The **Blanket Exercise will be held Sunday, June 19, at 11:30 at Campbell Collegiate High School (102 Massey Road)**, next door to the north of Immanuel church. Please use the main door at Campbell Collegiate that is closest to Immanuel. The Kairos Blanket Exercise is an interactive learning experience that teaches the Indigenous rights that is rarely taught. It was developed in response to the 1996 Report of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples as a highly recommended education method regarding Canadian Indigenous history as one of the key steps to reconciliation. The Blanket Exercise covers 500 years of history in a one-and-a-half-hour participatory workshop. It is a very powerful workshop.


Meditation Schedule: Meditation continues online! <u>Click here</u> to join at 7 pm on Mondays.
