I have been talking about the lack of support for our Canteen on Mondays, Tuesdays and Wednesdays for the last couple of months. Nothing seems to have changed very much. There has been requests to stay open after 7pm. We have to pay a bartender to work and if no one comes in to support it then we will continue to lose money on those days. We have been talking about changing our hours or closing completely on Mondays and Tuesdays. Due to the lack of support after 7pm changing our hours seems impractical. We can't remain open without the support!! Late last year we extended our hours until 9pm for several months to accommodate your requests and basically no one supported it so we changed them back to 7pm. One or two people will not pay the bartenders wages and pay for the overhead to stay open after 7pm. The canteen must make money to pay all the bills that occur monthly. For those that can't understand this I hope you understand that no support does not us allow us to extend our hours. This also does not allow us to hire additional bartenders because if they can't make money they will not work here!! 
