

## Growing to Know the Heavenly Family ------ With Pastor Eric

<sup>26</sup>John answered them, "I baptize with water. Among you stands one whom you do not know, <sup>27</sup>the one who is coming after me; I am not worthy to untie the thong of his sandal." <sup>28</sup>This took place in Bethany across the Jordan where John was baptizing. <sup>29</sup>The next day he saw Jesus coming toward him and declared,

"Here is the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world! <sup>30</sup>This is he of whom I said, 'After me comes a man who ranks ahead of me because he was before me.' <sup>31</sup>I myself did not know him; but I came baptizing with water for this reason, that he might be revealed to Israel." - John 1:26-31

Okay...I admit that I am one of those weirdo romantic types that believes in "love at first sight" and the "I feel like I've known you my whole life!" Yes, I was the guy who saw Teri in the Lutheran Campus Ministry fellowship hall from a distance and said, "Yep, she's the one!"

Now, things worked out for me ( $so\ far\ \mathfrak{S}$ ). However, everything about this attitude screams "red flags" and "watch out". The truth leans towards not jumping into a relationship, not to mention a marriage, without a sobering reality check. Before making heartfelt commitments, we step back and realize that we don't really know that much about the other person. This is the fun part – we get to ask questions and spend time getting to know them. Courtships and engagements have their place in our social development and believe it or not, our spiritual development as well. We tend to forget the importance of spending time learning about each other – not just at the beginning of a connection but throughout the life of the relationship. I read a marriage counseling insight which I share with couples during

pre-marriage discussions, that said, "If you spend at least 30% of your time and energy from courtship in your marriage, then you will thrive for a lifetime."

I want us to remember in October that we celebrate our Reformation heritage and Confirmation on the same day. Why? Because we are freed in Christ Jesus to read God's Word and live in the grace of God. This freedom allows us to live out our baptisms in a personal way with Jesus and God our Father (parent). As in any relationship, we live into it and learn more about the other continually – not just at confirmation – but throughout our entire existence as God's children. The Holy Spirit given to us at baptism and stirred up at confirmation continues to keep active and open every day within each of us. And as we know first-hand, relationships take time and energy to grow and thrive. I invite you to try three simple practices to help you get to know Jesus and God better.

- 1.) Read one verse of the Bible every day and take a moment to think about it. I recommend starting with the Gospel of John. You can read more than one if you feel it.
- 2.) Pray for one minute each day. The Lord's Prayer works but try just talking with God (Jesus) and take a few moments to listen as well.
- 3.) Put yourself in a position to trust God in some way. Maybe something small like helping a stranger, or a family member, comforting a friend, or texting someone encouragement, and be open to sharing a bit more about your faith, church, or Jesus if the opportunity comes.

John testified to the light and admitted that he was not the light, and neither are we. Our daily life is shining forth that light, and John did not know Jesus as Messiah, but he still lived his life pointing to Him and getting to know him along the way – and so should we because we are free to do so. May God's grace fill us with the light of Christ and give us the encouragement to share it with others and learn more about our heavenly family. Amen.

- Vision suggests activities for additional growth during the week to come.





#### <u>Pastor's Report</u>: Report provided to council members.

#### **New Business:**

- Parsonage Renovations Update
  - Kim and Bob Jensen have moved into the parsonage
  - Lease agreement is signed
  - o Deposit of \$1200 has been paid.
  - First rent is not due until Jan 1, 2024. This date is pushed out to compensate for all the work that's been done.
  - Original quote was \$63,000 and authorized for up to \$75,000 in total spend.
  - Couple of incidentals were to tear out floor and other flooring inside entry way
  - Repaired back roof area over deck
  - Nelson Electric had to fix oven wiring and non-working outlet
  - Original door/windows quote, thought front storm door was on quote had to add that
  - Halbrook plumbing did some extra work besides new shower
  - Needed new garage door due to age of door, bid for \$2000 was approved by committee
  - \$69,000 is new total
  - Spigots are leaking, will handle that in the future. We don't want the water to freeze.
- Sound system: Mark Pote, Nels Dovre, Chris Richter met. Getting quotes.
- Confirmation
  - It's something consistent and important to the congregation. Place for interaction with church members. Often, we have multiple school districts, this year is somewhat more a single school district. Over the past ten years the classes have changed a bit, classes are more

- stimulated. Can be challenges, always had challenges with certain kids. Have been able to deal with them.
- First class seemed like all the kids were on board. Mostly girls in this class. This is usually different than one with mostly boys.
- Program has changed. Giving the confirmands the task of operating slides. They are more than just acolytes. Trying to broaden participation in the church.
- Sermon notes are usually the most challenging. Some finish up their 12 sermon-note quota right away. Others procrastinate. It's a way to engage with the sermon. It can be either children's or normal sermon. Just trying to get kids to think critically about the message. Parents and families can help out with that.
- Pastor presented the Confirmation Curriculum. Engler motioned to approve. Pote seconded. All voted unanimously to approve the curriculum.
  - Sanquist asked if a female needed to be added to the leaders of the group since so many young females

Through this program, an individual moves from Supported Community Living into a private family home with a carefully selected Host Homes Provider who provides 24/7 support for the client.

"Working directly with my clients to help them complete goals and work around obstacles is my favorite part of my job," said Erica Hill Murray, a Host Homes Provider at LSI. "I enjoy showing them that there are people in their lives who care about them, are proud of them, and proud to help them."

Erica has helped many clients in the five years she has provided care at LSI, but one client, in particular, has made great strides under her care.

"I worked with a client who wanted to find a job or volunteer position, but she had two obstacles in her way: she had trouble using a computer, and she wasn't confident in her ability to speak in an interview," said Erica. "I offered to look for positions on the computer with her and to call potential employers to explain what she was looking for. After working with her, we found her a volunteer position for a couple of days a week, and she was delighted."

"She thanked me for helping her and said that she was happy that, for once, someone understood her drive to want to work," said Erica. "I like to make a difference – even if it is small. Helping others, no matter at what level, is impactful. I love working at LSI, and I believe my position as a Host Homes Provider has been my favorite position in life."
