UMCOR (United Methodist Committee on Relief) needs to replenish supplies sent to the Central Appalachian region affected by floods a few weeks ago. Each bucket and plastic bag must contain all items on the list. Join with others – Sunday School class, Trustees, Worship, friends, neighbors – to complete the list. Please deliver the items to Fellowship Hall by October 1.

UMCOR Menstrual Hygiene Kit ("Period Pack")

- 1-one-gallon size re-sealable bag
- 2-bottles hand sanitizer 2oz.
- 3-bathroom trash bags 4 gallon
- 1-travel pack of wet ones
- 5-tampons (regular, unscented)
- 5-tampons (super absorbency, unscented)
- 10-sanitary Napkins (long, super, ultra-thin, unscented)
- Bath-size soap (3 oz. bar or larger-no Ivory or Jergen's soap)
- Do not remove from packaging
- 1-pack of flushable wipes (42 count, unscented)
- 1-travel sink-size laundry detergent (.25-.45 oz.)



UMCOR Cleaning Kits

- 1- five-gallon round bucket with resealable lid (14.35" h x 12.19" w x 12.19" d)
No screw lids/ May be used, but must be free from all residual product / Advertisements on the outside acceptable
- 1- 32-64 oz. bottle liquid laundry detergent
- 1- 16-40 oz. bottle liquid concentrate household cleaner (No spray cleaners)
- 1- 16-34 oz. bottle dish soap
- 1- 4-8 oz. pump spray air freshener (liquid, not gel)
- 1- 6-14 oz. pump spray insect repellent (pack of 10-20 wipes also acceptable)
Pump spray bottles must have protective covers
- 1- scrub brush, with or without handle
- 18- re-useable cleaning wipes No terrycloth, microfiber or paper towels / Remove from packaging
- 5- scouring pads No stainless-steel pads with soap in them / Remove from packaging
- 36-50- clothespins
- 1- 50-100 ft. clothesline (cotton or plastic)
- 24- roll of heavy-duty trash bags (33-45- gallon sizes) / Remove from packaging
- 5- N95 particulate respirator dust masks (1-3 mm thickness) No surgical masks
- 2- pairs kitchen gloves Durable for multiple uses / Remove from packaging
- 1- pair work gloves Cotton with leather palm or all leather

Assembly Instructions: All items must be new with the exception of the bucket and lid which may be recycled but must be clean and free of debris. All cleaning agents must be liquid form. No powders are accepted.

Additional Notes: Sponges have been removed from the list of supplies due to the challenge of locating the non-cellulose sponges that prevent mildew. Non-cellulose sponges will be added to each bucket upon arrival at the affiliate warehouse. Do not include any personal notes, money or additional material in the kits. Contents of kits or the containers of kits should not be imprinted with cartoon characters, advertisements, religious, patriotic, military or camouflage symbols.

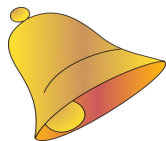
