The Banquet will be free to D.D.A. members and a fee of \$10.00 will be charged for guests of those members. However, if you are planning to attend, you must make reservations before May 8 and present your membership card to be admitted.

Along with dinner, the presentation of awards, music and dancing, a short meeting with elections are planned. This years elections will be for the Presidency and five (5) Trustees. The nominees for these positions should be qualified and be willing to give much of their time and energy. Remember, you as well as the people you elect to the Board are responsible for the maintenance and growth of your association. Your participation and support are instrumental to the future of the D.D.A. The more support you display, the easier it becomes to make it through the troubles and problems encountered and results in a stronger and better association.

DIVISION & BRACKET SINGLES

Committee chairman, PETE MOUGEY, has planned division and bracket singles competition to be held at the end of our season. Pete has spent numerous hours working out the details.

The division singles event is for members, in good standing, to compete on an individual level to determine the best player of their division. The format will be operated in a lucky sixteen format. That is each player will be drawn into brackets of no more than eight players and play a round robin, that is play each player in their bracket with each win worth one point. The player with the most points will win their bracket. All matches will be 501, best of three games.

Each bracket winner will be placed into a final bracket and once again play a round robin with the winner designated Division Singles Champion.

The bracket championships will be operated in the same manner as the division championships except competition is open to members in their particular bracket. The "A" bracket consists of the Gem, Gold, Silver and Bronze divisions. The "B" bracket consists of the Blue, Red, Orange and Green divisions. The "C" bracket consists of the Yellow, White, Brown, Gray and Scarlet divisions.

The division championships are open to all members, in good standing, at no charge. The bracket championships will have a \$5.00 per player entry fee with each division champion entered at no charge and seeded into the brackets.

Awards consist of plaques for the division champions, certificates of placement and shirts for each of the bracket champions. The bracket championships will also have cash payouts determined by the number of entries.

This year's events feature a much earlier start time, 5:30 pm, which will ensure completion of matches at an earlier time than in the past. Registration for each event closes at 5:00 pm so be there early and on time.

LETTERS TO THE EDITOR:

First of all, I would like to extend congratulations to the newly elected Board of Directors of the North Dayton Darting Association [N.D.D.A.]. It seems the membership chose a fine group to represent them and their association.

Secondly, I find it shameful that within a few weeks of the elections by the membership, a handful of small minded self centered individuals are beginning to create waves and asking for resignations in attempts to get their own way.

Specifically, a recently elected Board Member of the N.D.D.A., who is also a Board Member of the D.D.A., was asked to resign his position in the D.D.A. or N.D.D.A. because someone felt it was a conflict of interest to serve on both boards. Does this mean that anyone holding a position on both boards should resign one of their positions so the duties of one position don't conflict with the duties of the other position. If so, do you then say the same for anyone holding office in one association and being a member of another association or for that matter, is it a conflict of interest to simultaneously be a member of two different associations.

Finally, contrary to the claim of a few who view holding office in two associations as a "conflict of interest", I feel it actually serves a "common interest" --- the promotion of darts and the betterment of the sport.
