An update on Chaya since her original 2018 interview with Rabbinit Taleah Grimmage I was asked to be President and I felt the need to really take this role because I think it's imperative that our YOUTH see our other youth in ministerial ordained positions. Too often we come to a narrow census of what a ministerial position is, truth is the waters of those positions run deep, any person anointed and appointed to carry a village on their back has reached a point of ministerial-ship, from being a worship leader, to sitting on the pulpit, to ushering someone to their seat, it all takes a special ordination, I want our young people to not feel discouraged and nervous when told they might sit on the rostrum one day, or be the president of the Rabbi's aid committee, the youth are the future of CTB and if as a congregation we don't start allowing our youth to be in certain positions, they won't see a need for what they've been ordained to do. I want the spirit of passion to have influence on the young people, because when you're comfortable within your ministry it rubs off on others, I want our young people to feel comfortable in their ordinations, no title is too big or too small if G-D has assigned you to it, it was meant for you. If our confessions and actions don't align with our principles and propositions we preach how can we teach them?

Why are the Youth of the Temple so important?

This is not just something said but something truthful "that the youth are the future". We need to write our vision and make it plain, we must amalgamate the young and the old, so that one can learn from the other & bridge the gap of time & space stolen by differences.

The youth have to make themselves more available to participate and be genuinely active in service and the old must remain humble and apprehensive. We have to realize that without the youth our congregation will not flourish.

3 things I wish people understood about young people are:

- Within our community the hardest thing is Juggling our spiritual lives, our school/ work/ careers & our social lives, while our faith may be unwavering, worldly distractions come to defeat our minds & belittle our faith, our school/ work/ careers are things we live through & often need breaks from, when mental health isn't taken seriously for so long in any community, it fuels generational curses & causes one to slowly lose their soul, and our social lives play one of the biggest roles as that reveals our interactants, these all go into a category of self identity which most try to polish & mold at a young age, as young people in a agnostic and anti black Babylonic generation it's often hard to express your most authentic self, there are pieces of us that we want revealed but are often challenged by society.
- We live in a promental preservation generation, we fight for our soul & mind in this generation, most of us are fighting a battle to break generational curses placed on our bloodline and community as a whole. We are fighting to live and not just to survive.
- We are a technologically enhanced generation.. so YES we are always on our phone.

What are your favorite aspects of the BYOM?

The fact that we are engaged and eager to unite every Shabbat, and also the fact that even though not all blood we are family and we can act as one, we have a community that is like no other community, from the way we joke, play, and love one another. It is one of a kind!

What do you believe are some of the most important issues young people face and what can our community do to support?

Depression, anxiety, self identification and loneliness. As a community, we come together and love one another but I think we should invest into sitting down with the young people and talking

to them and encouraging them. It's fine to tell someone to pray, but what if they don't know how? What if that's not enough? I think we should invest time into actually having genuine conversations that heal people.

Three things you always have with you are:

First is My Phone, I am always willing to talk or listen or even just to stop what I'm doing and pray for you. I am very open-minded and ready to help anyone at any time! And I'm probably scrolling through the Facebook timeline.

Second is a smile on my face. You never know who's down and your smile, even in your own sadness can be the very thing to brighten someone's day vice versa.

And lastly a pen, I love to write, from the smallest to the most drastic things in my day they all deserve to go on paper, writing is a powerful outlet to express how you feel, and expression opens different portals of healing.




