Pastor's thoughts ...

Hello St. Mark's Lutheran,

Here we are deep into September. Football has begun in earnest. Elyse and I have gone to our first apple orchard, picked some beauties, and sampled some cider. It was truly fantastic, even if it was 90 degrees. But if we look around we can see the beginnings of that startling autumn transformation as the trees green leaves become gold, orange, and red in preparation for winter's embrace. What a beautiful time of year in God's great creation. I hope you get out and enjoy that, and then share stories of your adventures with family and friends.

In my devotions this week I came across a passage that really spoke to me. It comes from 1 Peter 3:15-16, "but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence."

This is something I touch on often in sermons... that we should know our faith well in our hearts. If that means being ready if someone would question us about our faith... fantastic.
