## Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act - Up for Vote in the House

Judiciary Committee Chairman Bob Goodlatte (R-Va.) supports House Judiciary Committee's Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017 (S. 305).

This bill would amend Section 6(d) of title 4, United States Code, to encourage the display of the U.S. flag on National Vietnam War Veterans Day, which is honored each year on March 29. Introduced by Senator Toomey, S. 305 passed the Senate by Unanimous Consent last month.

Any recognition these veterans receive now is an insufficient substitute for the recognition they should have received when they first arrived back in the United States. And while nothing can remove the pain surrounding the hollow reception these veterans received, one can hope that their sacrifice, which continued well after the war, will help ensure that this generation of veterans.

The Department of Defense announced a policy change that will extend limited online military exchange shopping privileges to all honorably discharged veterans of the military effective this Veterans Day, November 11, 2017

Privileges exclude the purchase of uniforms, alcohol and tobacco products. This service is provided as a small, tangible way of saying, 'Thank you' to those who served. The DoD feels the online benefit will also strengthen the exchanges' online businesses by doubling the exchanges' online presence improving the experience for all through improved vendor terms, more competitive merchandise assortments, and improved efficiencies.

Boys' State will be held from June 25 through July 1, 2017 at SUNY Morrisville State College in Morrisville, NY. The boys may enroll between 11:00 am and 1:00 pm on Sunday, June 25, and must leave on Saturday, July 1 at 8:00 am following breakfast. Lunch will not be provided on Sunday, June 25, 2017. Attendees should have lunch prior to their arrival.

The 2017 American Legion Auxiliary Empire Girls State program will be held July 2, 2017- July 8, 2017 at The College of Brockport in Brockport, NY. Richmond County is going to send five girls in all. When Girls State candidates finish their program they will share their experiences at meeting in October at Marine Corps League. The Post is invited.

Boys' State is not a summer camp! Although there will be designated recreation times, Boys' State is NOT a picnic – NOT an outing – NOT a sports camp. Sponsoring groups are asked to note that Boys' State is in no way a rehabilitative, disciplinary, or recreational camp. Only young men with outstanding qualifications in leadership, character, scholarship, service, and citizenship who have a serious attitude toward an intensive citizenship training program should be selected. Appearance, neatness, and good grooming are expected of Boys' State participants. Attitude and appearance go hand-in-hand and the ability to follow directions is a must. The image projected by candidates to Boys' State reflects upon the youth of America.

Empire Girls State is a hands-on week-long educational workshop, focusing on Americanism and the political process, sponsored by the New York State American Legion Auxiliary. During their week these students, under the guidance of the Americanism Chairman, will also learn proper flag etiquette, participate in and create either a flag lowering or raising ceremony, and participate in a POW-MIA Ceremony.


The goal of the program is to help students to better understand democratic ideals and the part we as individuals play in carrying out these ideals. This program, which has been accredited by the National College Credit Recommendation Service (National CCRS) is a non-partisan attempt to teach high school junior girls about government, politics, and Americanism.

Students are selected to become citizens a mythical 51st State, from the county to the state level. As the government begins to take shape, these young women come to understand their roles in a democratic society.

# Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017

115th CONGRESS 1st Session S. 305

#### IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

February 6, 2017

Referred to the Committee on the Judiciary

#### AN ACT

To amend title 4, United States Code, to encourage the display of the flag of the United States on National Vietnam War Veterans Day.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

This Act may be cited as the ``Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017".

SEC. 2. DISPLAY OF FLAG ON NATIONAL VIETNAM WAR VETERANS DAY.

Section 6(d) of title 4, United States Code, is amended by inserting ``National Vietnam War Veterans Day, March 29;" after ``third Monday in February;".

Passed the Senate February 3, 2017.


