Hello members!!!!

We are still without a Rear Commodore, so the current officers are sharing those duties. We are keeping the cruising schedule on track, in hopes of normal boating. We are currently trying to make reservations at marinas that are allowing them to be made. With boating being more popular than ever, we could have competition for those slips. We will keep all of you posted in the next Anchorline.

It may not be snowing but winter is here and here are some tips for winterization.....

- 1. Are your fuel tanks 7/8 full so you can add a fuel/diesel stabilizer? Are they stopped off for winter storage?
- 2. Do not forget about your outboard and genset; they need love/winterization too.
- 3. Check the levels in your batteries and of course the terminal connections.
- 4. Football season over for you? Try changing the oil and fuel filters now instead of springtime.

5. Like being able to microwave that burrito after an extended WSYC happy hour? Well then let's get those shore power cords inspected. Look for cracks, bent blades, broken lock rings and general signs of overheating. Inspect the female portion for corrosion and overheating. Pinch points can be a cause of overheating and potential fire. Spray connectors with an electrical contact cleaner.

6. Keep moisture down inside your boat this winter as well; use a dehumidifier or a DampRid type product. Lifting cushions and mattresses keep that damp smell at bay. Air circulation is key, open the interior doors, hatches. Marine grade electric heaters or an oil filled heater keeps the interior toasty as well. Verify all cords are good, they will age as well. Moisture in the bilge can be rectified by a bilge heater safely mounted... Golden Rod makes a great product.
