



Based in the San Luis Valley at the headwaters of the Rio Grande, Rio de la Vista works with local, regional, and international nonprofit organizations, land management agencies, community groups, and landowners to achieve land, water and habitat conservation and restoration, agricultural viability, and community sustainability. Rio serves as the Environmental Representative on the Rio Grande Roundtable where she has been a member since 2005.

With the Rio Grande Headwaters Land Trust, she is Associate Director and Coordinator for the *Rio Grande Initiative*, a broad partnership of conservation organizations that has achieved over \$43 million in conservation, including over 26,000 conserved acres along the Rio Grande and Conejos River corridors since 2007. She also serves as the Environmental Representative for the Rio Grande Basin Roundtable.

Rio was honored to receive the 2011 National Wetlands Award for Conservation and Restoration from the Environmental Law Institute, in recognition of her work in the San Luis Valley

Rio earned her degree in Journalism from the University of Colorado, Boulder. She is the author of many articles and co-author of the eco-novel “The Oglin: A Hero’s Journey Across Africa Towards the Tomorrows” with Dick Richardson of South Africa.
